## The coming meeting – Friday 19<sup>th</sup> January Crossrail – the Elizabeth line.

**Clive Kessell** – Retired signalling expert from whatever they now call British Railways – a professional engineer and a copious rail journalist – is coming to give us another of his great talks.



If you ever have a chance to travel on a train with Clive you will find that he makes it a fascinating experience. Clive has a wealth of knowledge on all matters to do with rail systems; motive transport; electrification; passenger vehicles and signalling – where he has been acknowledged as the "go to" expert on signalling matters. Clive is a close contemporary of mine, hailing from the same town (Luton) and attending the same school (Luton Grammar) in the same Science 6<sup>th</sup> form within a year of each other. Our Science 6<sup>th</sup> was so large that it was no surprise that we never met, despite having the same teachers!

Clive knows literally all about the development and management of rail communication systems. On Friday he will be regaling us about Crossrail – aka The Elizabeth Line. Crossrail was Europe's largest civil engineering project, and the undertaking was completed, snaking right through central London, without most of us even knowing a thing about it. The undertaking was absolutely massive. The project took 15 years and cost £18.9 billion - £4 billion over budget and 4 years later than hoped for. Total length is 73 miles starting at the west at Heathrow and ending at Shenfield or Abbey Wood, with 26 miles in tunnels. Excavation through the centre of London meant carefully boring tunnels within centimetres of existing structures. And there were the listed building which could not be allowed to move, settle, crack or shake.....

Clive's main interest is signalling. I remember a few years ago he was shaking his head as he told me that they were going to have to integrate four different systems for the driver.

If we run out of questions, try asking Clive about HS2!

#### A review of the Autumn term

There are some interesting issues. You will remember that we had agreed to set a nominal £10 membership fee at the start of the Autumn term, based on the expected number of members; the proportion that we thought likelyn to support the group each month, and the cost of our current venue – St John's Felbridge Church hall.

There is good news and some indifferent news, and we also elected to postpone our December meeting, due to COVID infections (and sagging numbers due to the "Seasonal" effect.)

Once we broadcast the news that we were dropping the monthly attendance charge in favour of a prepaid £10 joining fee for the term we lost a handful of members. At the start of September we had 59 registered members – so we were looking for £590. We are charged £60 per meeting, so an average of 10 or 11 meetings through the year meant that we needed to collect an average of \$600-£660. Not all the 59 attended in the end, and so we collected some £472 – (not sure where the £2 came from!). 11 members have not paid up (yet) and 10 of the 59 have not yet attended a meeting.

We always ask everyone of the 59 to either confirm they are coming or to send an apology if they are not.

**Sadly a disappointingly high proportion do not communicate at all.** We do know what a number of members are otherwise committed. Ignoring those we will be striking off those members whose names really shouldn't be on the list.

## The good news is that we have a healthy surplus of £292 on account at the end of 2023, so there will be NO TERMLY payment for the spring term
