## IT matters – (Really!)

#### A new website

Eight years ago we launched a website. We used a "harness" called U3A SiteBuilder, provided by the Third Age Trust, along with some 500 other u3a organisations. SiteBuilder was pretty limiting in its capability. But in 2023 it begins to look archaic. Our website has grown in complexity and needs radical reorganisation. The Trust is now providing us with a new tool called SiteWorks, which embodies up to date capability and construction. This is due to be released "in the Autumn", so we await delivery with baited breath. Our web managing expert, Malcolm Francis, is currently supervising the migration.

### Our Beacon system

Implemented three and a half years ago, the membership management section works smoothly. Group leaders are managing interest groups and sending GDPR compliant emails to members. There is much untapped capability in Beacon. eg: This year the Trust added the capability for every member to create a personal Membership Account. 300 members have already created their account, which empowers them to join or leave interest groups online, to change personal data – and (next year) to renew online. To create an account, follow the link to Beacon on our website.
