

**Local Regiments:**

Founded in Dublin 1702 by:

Thomas Meredith  
(*Thomas Meredyth*)  
(c. 1661 – 19/06/1719)

Originally known as Meredith's Regiment

(Meredith was a friend of Charles Seymour, 6<sup>th</sup> Duke of Somerset and of John Churchill, 1<sup>st</sup> Duke of Marlborough)

War of Spanish Succession (1702 -13)

[1751] 37<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot

[1783] 37<sup>th</sup> North Hampshires

NOT at Waterloo

Founded in Devon in 1688 by

Sir Richard Payton

Originally 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion 20<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot

1758 reconstituted as 67<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot

1783 67<sup>th</sup> South Hampshires

NOT at Waterloo

1<sup>st</sup> July 1881  
Hampshire Regiment

Founded in Belfast 1701 by:

Arthur Chichester, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Donegall  
(c. 1666 – 10/04/1706)

Originally known as the Earl of Donegall's Regiment, as a symbol of royal approval allowed to wear orange facing's on their uniform

War of Spanish Succession (1702 -13)

[1751] 35<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot

[1787] 35<sup>th</sup> Sussex

570 men at Waterloo, under Major C. M. Macalister as part of General Lord Hill's II Corp, based at Hal. Did not see any action.

1832 Royal Sussex Regiment – facings change from orange to blue

Formed in 1854 by the East India Company as 3<sup>rd</sup> Bengal (European) Light Infantry

[1862] 107<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot

1<sup>st</sup> July 1881  
Royal Sussex Regiment
