Each week we will look at an aspect of poetry and aim to leave each session with a deeper understanding of a particular poem and a wider understanding of its creative context.

Meetings will be once a month, probably in Knowle Village Hall on a weekday afternoon. I hope to start the group in the autumn, but this will depend upon the degree of interest generated by this proposal.

#### Weekly Zoom Coffee & Chat – and live streaming

All members of Exmouth & District u3a are VERY welcome to join us on Thursday mornings for our Zoom Coffee & Chat sessions. Sometimes this includes live streaming.

They are very friendly, informal sessions held every Thursday morning. They start at 10.30, but we suggest everyone logs in from 10.15.

There is no limit to the number of members, so you can always join in using your Smartphone, iPad/Tablet or computer. Coffee & Chat sessions (C&C's) last for about an hour but you can always leave a meeting if you have to be somewhere or do something else. It's very free and easy but don't take our word for it, sound out our members you may know. You don't have to attend each C&C either. Some of our C&C members have told us it is a unique opportunity for those who are pretty much housebound.

Once connected, and you have the ZOOM App (or computer program) installed, it's easy too. It doesn't require lots of technical knowledge but advice about getting started is available if wanted.

You may have something you would like to ask about or share, examples being u3a activities you have participated in as a group member, films, TV or Radio programmes seen or any topic which might be of interest to others. A weekly coffee & chat (C&C) is a very good opportunity for a 'newsy' item, make friends, get to recognise and know members names, share a few photos, tell short stories (real and imagined), share art and craft work or just enjoy a Thursday morning by listening and, when you want, yourself adding to all the "Chattering". It can be a great opportunity to discuss local events or matters of concern or interest.

In addition, from time-to-time we experiment with some live 'outside broadcasts' from other places just for interest and for fun! Examples being members sharing their Smartphone's Zoom link from train journeys, holidays in England, even a holiday walkabout of sights in a medieval

#### Art Appreciation visit to The Box, Plymouth

On Wednesday July 26<sup>th</sup>, three of us went to The Box in Plymouth. This trip had been planned for July 2020 for its reopening but, like many other plans, had to be cancelled. We spent a fascinating day there, looking at three special exhibitions:

The first was in the new exhibition space, St Luke's church. It was by Rana Begum (born 1977), 'Dappled Light'. Rana is a London-based visual artist whose work explores the relationships between light, colour and form.

This work, 'Mesh' (2021) was one of 8 works displayed in St Luke's but other works were in the main part of

After this, we went to see the 'Armada Portrait of Queen Elizabeth' (c.1588). It commemorates the defeat of the Spanish Armada in 1588. It shows Elizabeth triumphant, with the storm-lashed Spanish fleet behind her on the right and the English ships sailing through calm waters on her left.

Finally, we went to see 'Reframing Reynolds: A Celebration' which is in celebrating the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of the famous portrait artist, Sir Joshua Reynolds, who was born in Plympton St Maurice. This is a portrait of Lady Ann Banfay, painted around 1754, after her marriage to captain Hugh Banfay. With her hand on her hip, Reynolds uses a pose of assertiveness and strength, one that was traditionally only use for male portraiture. To its left, Rana Begum represents the main colour palette using acrylic on aluminium.

# Bird Watching Group 2

Nightjars - Aylesbeare Common 19th July 2023

Seven of us, Alex, Sandy, Debbie, Paul, Liz and Vicky met at Joneys Cross car park on Aylesbeare Common at 2045 on the 19th July. During the previous week there had been heavy rain and high winds. Wednesday was bright with reasonable temperatures and a light breeze.

We walked across the common towards lower ground, when Vicky and Sandy saw a Yellow Hammer and heard its call of "a little bit of bread and no cheeeese".

We stopped at a clearing between the trees and a pond and waited as the sun set. At about 2140 we started to hear the characteristic church of the nightjar. We walked east along a well- defined track towards the source of the churring and paused where we had a clear view of the sky between the trees. After a short while we were rewarded with our first sighting of a nightjar flying close over our heads. We waited for a short while before retracing our path to our previous location. Alex, Sandy and Paul went on ahead and were rewarded with two further sightings of nightjars overhead. The rest of us joined them as we climbed the hill and saw a distant lone nightjar flying low down the valley.

We returned to the cars glad we had seen nightjars with Alex especially pleased as it was his first sighting.
