As Christmas and New Year celebrations fade away into the past, we need something new to look forward to in these post-holiday days. The days are getting longer and spring must be around the corner and for your u3a committee the season of membership renewals is fast approaching.

As <u>existing</u> members, you do not need to do anything at the moment – we'll be detailing the membership renewal process in the next newsletter

in March with renewals from April 1st. I am writing to offer my sincere thanks to your members for their donations of £71.59 following George's recent presentation to you all. I do hope everyone found his talk interesting and informative. A formal receipt No. 358966 is attached.

As a Charity, we depend on the support of people like you to help us to reach out to our local community. Our volunteer lifeboat crew members give their time for free, but they need training, well maintained equipment, lifeboats, and shore facilities. Your support has meant and continues to mean that our crews can save lives quickly, safely, and effectively.

The seas, beaches and waterways watched over by our lifesavers are enjoyed by millions of people every year. However, the water remains an unpredictable environment that can catch people unawares. People will always need our help and thanks to your support and help in raising awareness we will always be there to answer that call.

In 2022 Lifeboats launched 9312 times, saving 389 lives, - Exmouth was a key part in this, launching 75 times and aiding 73 people. This means that many people would have had their lives changed or even not have been here today without the crews and your help in supporting them.

First Aid Course

Several people have enquired about the possibility of taking a first aid course within the U3A. We have found a course which lasts around 4 hours and is suitable for people who wish to learn basic first aid for adults. The course will include: Dealing with an emergency; Bystander effect; Unresponsive and breathing (recovery); Unresponsive and not breathing (CPR and AED); Seizures; Burns; Bleeding heavily; Broken bones, strains and sprains; Head injury; Choking; Heart attack; Stroke; Severe allergic reactions and Diabetic emergency. The cost of this would be around £40.00 per person in a group of up to 12 people. If you are interested, please could you contact me at secretary@exmouthu3a.org.uk by 22th January 2024.

Forthcoming event

River Exe Bird Watching Cruise - 23rd February 2024 at 12:45pm, £12.50 per person

There are 30 places available on Stuart Line's River Exe Bird Watching Cruise. If you've never been on this cruise before, it's an opportunity to see the birds that winter on the river close-up before they fly off to pastures new. There is an ornithologist on board to help with identification so if you have binoculars, it is well worth bringing them. Places are limited so please book early. You can book pasties by Chunk of Devon (steak or roasted root vegetable (vegan) at £4.50 each). The cruise departs at 12:45pm with boarding from 12:15pm and lasts approximately 3hrs.

Before arranging any event, the social committee research facts relating to health and safety in order to fully support our members. Any particular issues relating to health and safety are listed on our webpage as well as included on your ticket, but it cannot be stated too strongly that members must consider their own capabilities before joining groups and excursions. In addition, members must ensure they wear suitable apparel and take walking aids as necessary to meet all weathers and ground conditions.

Health and safety considerations for this trip: February can be cold, so please wrap up well especially if spending time on the open deck. The boarding can be a little slippery at that time of year.

SYMONDS YAT - A TALK TO OUR ZOOM GROUP



At our Zoom Coffee and Chat Group meeting on 9 November 23, Ian McLauchlin remembered a few of the many walks he'd done. He mentioned a school Geology Field trip and the relief when descending from Scafell Pike in the Lake District, but he concentrated on a wonderful walk in Herefordshire around Symonds Yat, adjoining the River Wye. He'd found details in the AA Book of Country Walks – "No Through Road".

It was a warm sunny day in spring, just the sort of weather

to tempt you out after a cold winter. We parked in the Ferrie Inn car park and set off along the banks of the river, and soon headed uphill into the forest. There were caves and views from a rocky outcrop over the River and you had to be careful not to go too near the edge. Further along, through Lord's Wood, we came across King Arthur's Cave. If you were brave enough, you could clamber through it while the headroom became frighteningly low. We were brave enough! Eventually, after a few bangs on the head and scrapes on the arm, we emerged into the sun at the furthest exit.

The walk continued through the forest and eventually sloped down back to the River Wye. There was a footbridge. It was suspended precariously from wire ropes and it rattled and swayed when you walked across it. Not for the fainthearted. The footbridge was made of coarse wire mesh and that's what you walked on. You could see the river below with every step, which made each step a test of faith.





While we were contemplating the crossing we became aware of a film crew. They were shooting scenes for a TV detective series "Shoestring" with Trevor Eve. One scene involved two police cars racing towards each other. They braked hard and, because the surface was gravel, they skidded and collided with each other. "Cut" shouted someone. They had to shoot the scene again. They may have had to replace the cars too. . . . In another scene, Trevor Eve chased someone through the woods and they both ended up crossing that wire

bridge. You could hear the clanging and see the bridge sway.

In a way, that was the highlight of the walk, though it was such an interesting walk there were very many highlights. I'd thoroughly recommend it but, unfortunately, can't promise any Shoestring filming.
