

Technological advances and better telecommunications have improved safety at sea but there is no substitute for a watchful pair of eyes by a trained member of Coastwatch. Hugh will talk about the important and indispensable work of HM Coastwatch Agency and their campaigns such as 'Coast Clever' which features footballer Adevayo Akinfenwa who educates audiences about the importance of checking tides and how to stay safe near cliffs and mud
14 Sep	'Wildlife Wanderings' David Bailey	David took his first television interview with Steve Etches the world-famous fossil collector talking about Steve's father who was a photographer, which will be a feature in a forth coming eight-part documentary called <b>Plumbing the Depths</b> , David has also been filmed for a feature yet to be shown on ITV Wales Coast & Country talking about his work.



## **Bird Group 1**

## Walk to Challacombe Sunday, 14th May

Four intrepid birders led by Dick made an early start to get a parking slot at Grimspound. We made our way down the slope towards Headland Warren

Farm and were soon rewarded with sightings of Wren, Whinchat, Stonechat and Wheatear. There were plenty of Meadow Pipits about but no sign nor sound of a Cuckoo. Birdsong abounded, most of which Dick was able to identify as the conditions were near perfect with light wind and bright light.







As we approached Challacombe Farm the bluebells appeared like a blue mist over the terraced fields. Nearing the buildings, Dick spotted a pair of Stock Doves. The Redstart and Flycatchers could be heard but were proving elusive. A Great Spotted Woodpecker put in a brief appearance and glimpses of Grey and Pied Wagtails and a Dipper were seen by the stream and then a Redstart very obligingly decided to perch on a fence post next to the lane where we all had a really good view. A filling finale to a beautiful walk.

Other birds seen: Swallows, Great & Blue Tits. Other birds heard included Willow Warblers, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff and Blackcap. Butterflies seen included, Brimstone, Orange Tip and Green Veined White.

## **Bird Watching Group 2**

We started by walking along the open playing fields where we had sightings of magpie, wood pigeon, blackbird, swallow, blackcap, great tit and chaffinch. As we crossed the bridge it was obvious the river had washed away part of the bank where sand martins often nest, although the cooler Spring may also have contributed to their absence. The highlight of the next part of the walk along the river was seeing a kingfisher in flight and a small group of wagtails - grey, yellow and pied - catching the insects around the weir, followed by a cormorant swimming and diving

as well as earlier seeing two instances of them flying low along the river. The other sightings were mallard, dunnock, jackdaw, long tailed tit, goldfinch, greenfinch and a buzzard. Unfortunately, the later Spring had delayed the wild flowers where we have previously seen many damsel flies however, we did spot an orange tip butterfly. The walk along the old railway track was much less productive than previously, however later along the edge of the playing field we did see a closed wing peacock butterfly.

We arrived back after a pleasant two hour walk which it was generally agreed was enjoyable because of the varied sightings along the river.

Ship memorabilia. That leads into,


The cottage, with the Tableau's and cases that are full of interesting items.

the Museum's Honiton Lace Collection.







Nowadays all the swans are free flying and provides sanctuary for them, they are free to come and go as they wish. It was lovely to see all the cygnets and just a few black swans making a visit.

This is to be a social get-together for members to just meet-up, hopefully get to know one another and have that rare opportunity of just relaxing and chatting. ## Remembering Ella Young - member of Exmouth and District u3a

Ella's younger son Jonathan has written to let us know that Ella died peacefully on Weds 31st May and that she had been cared for with great dedication on the Hospiscare ward in Exeter.

I first met Ella on 'Zoom' at one of our weekly Exmouth and District u3a 'Connect on Thursday' sessions during the Lockdowns. It was evident that Ella was a most interesting, caring and thoughtful person passionate about



the environment and so willing to take part and contribute to our u3a in any way she could.

And 'help and contribute' she certainly did through her well researched, fascinating presentations which she shared with a large group of us over 'Zoom' during the Lockdowns and restrictions. What a difference this made to us all with very few opportunities to get out and about and especially for our members who were housebound.

We were transported to the Czech Republic and Slovakia to learn about Christmas traditions and considerably more snow

than we were experiencing in the South West. It was lovely too to see scenes of Ella enjoying time with her family. On other occasions Ella captured our interest with her amazing tales of a walking holiday with camels, her great knowledge of bird song, her recollections of

a visit to the Galapagos in 2006 with information about Darwin's visit and findings. Then a shared presentation with others from our u3a 'Zoom' into Poetry group with readings from her own 'Yew Tree' poetry book published during Lockdown including her pertinent words about our ever changing world:

"Our world is changing

too fast.

too fast.

Ice melts, then permafrost,
Dark tundra absorbs the sun's rays,
Buildings lean and roads subside.
The ancient methane floats up

To amplify the greenhouse heat. "

A member of our u3a from October 2020, Ella was certainly an active member as she was also a Group Organiser for an online book group and a discussion group and a member of Topsham books. As well as our u3a she also belonged to Exeter u3a.

Last year Ella had the idea of 'Local circles' for our u3a writing to me with the following suggestion: "What do you feel about having local u3a circles? We could meet for coffee or strolls or both, and share cars to meetings at the Pavilion or other places. All we need is one person from each area to collect contact details from anyone who wants to be part of a local group, and arrange a first meeting." The Local circles' now called 'Hubs' really took off and are flourishing and there are now more than 10 'Hubs' all because of that initial idea of Ella's.

In a relatively short time Ella made a positive difference to our u3a and it was certainly a privilege to meet her and to get to know such a compassionate person.
