

Covid-19 information



Social Group News



Review of 'A Photographic Journey Around the South West Footpath' by Gary Holpin - Thursday 10th February 2022



Gary started his presentation by asking members if they had walked part of the South West Coast path and the vast majority of our members raised their hands. When asked if they had walked the entire way no hands were raised which isn't surprising for the longest of England's national trails at 1,014 km or 630 miles. However it was obvious from the excellent questions at the end that some of our members had walked some of the more difficult stretches and were keen to walk more of the South West Coast path. We were grateful to Gary for allowing us to 'live stream' his presentation and indeed one of the questions came from one of the 42 members who had logged on from home.

Having moved to Devon for work Gary was determined to find out more about the South West area he had moved to and what better way experience the landscapes, seascapes, towns and villages by exploring the walks of the South West Coast path starting in Minehead, Somerset and ending in Poole, Dorset visiting much of Devon and Cornwall as he trekked up many steep paths. Indeed as Gary explained the total height climbed at just over 35,000 metres is almost four times the height of Mount Everest.








A first walk along the entire trail is a real achievement but being bitterly disappointed with his photographs Gary set out to walk the trail again, this time in a clockwise direction with the aim of completing all sections and improving his photography along the way. The record for running the entire length is just over 10 days but most people complete the trail by walking different sections over a number of years as Gary did.


As well as wonderful photographs we were shown a photo of plasters, very necessary as Gary soon found out when he developed blisters. However this didn't deter Gary as he continued with his walks.

We were treated to some stunning well composed photos and it was clear that Gary was determined to secure those definitive shots whatever the weather or the time of day or night including standing on Paignton beach in a blizzard, facing the Beast from the East in Sidmouth and then an inspirational shot of the Milky Way over Sidmouth at 03:00!

We were privileged to see some of Gary's favourite places as he developed his passion for photography such as Vendor Falls near Ashburton, Kennick Reservoir for the reflections and Emsworthy for the bluebells all in the Dartmoor National Park.

By the end we knew that long coastal walks had helped Gary 'really see' the beauty and drama of the fabulous area covered by the South West Coast path, a favourite being a view overlooking Salcombe visited 30 times by Gary since his walk there in 2009. Review of Ella Young's 'A Walking Holiday in the Sahara' - 24th February 2022 on Zoom



Since we started using Zoom in the spring of 2020 Ella has given us a number of presentations and they have all been most interesting and entertaining. Ella who is a member of both our u3a and Exeter u3a missed their monthly meeting to give her talk but kindly agreed that we could record her session as she knew a number of her friends would miss her presentation and her excellent session is available for you to look at (or look at again) on our YouTube site, thanks to the excellent work that Ian McLauchlin has done in recording and editing this video. Through Ella's stunning photographs and Ella's well-chosen words we were transported to a different way of living. In 2004 Ella enjoyed a holiday with a difference, walking in the Sahara with camels carrying your luggage in the Republic of Tunisia, the northernmost country in Africa. On the week long holiday you were only allowed one ride each on a camel unless you had trodden on a scorpion as one holiday maker had. You were asked to take minimal luggage and Ella certainly achieved this with her compact sleeping bag and a bivy bag. The only problem was that on her first night her male camel was most reluctant to allow her to retrieve her luggage and she decided not to argue with the camel.



We were fortunate that Ella had been careful with her camera equipment so that we could picture the scenes of cooking unleavened bread over an open fire, the loading up of the camels, gathering at a well and sleeping in a tent at night with clear star lit skies. Others on the holiday suffered from sand in their cameras resulting in camera failure which must have been a major disappointment.





Since 2004 there have been many changes in the region and The Republic of Tunisia is currently in 'a state of emergency' and travel is not advised to many areas. However with an area of 9,200,000 square kilometres the Sahara spans eleven countries and 'Adventure' holidays in the Sahara are still available in 2022.

Thank you Ella for another wonderful presentation.

Did you know the staff and volunteers at Open Door Exmouth Community Café welcomes anyone and everyone, not just those in need? Why not pop in one afternoon when we are open, (Monday, Wednesday or Friday) and enjoy good quality food and drink at extremely competitive prices. For those who are in need, we have a team of volunteers who can offer time to listen or chat or even play a boardgame. We also have trained support workers should you need any advice or support regarding benefits or financial difficulties, housing or homelessness issues, addictions, domestic abuse or any other issues, and a counselling service for those who cannot access NHS or private counselling. If we are unable to help, we will try to suggest an alternative organisation that may be able to. We also have showers, clothing including sleeping bags, and laundry facilities available for those who are homeless.

We also provide free hot meals during school holidays to children and their families who find themselves in need due to financial crisis, and free hot meals as part of our support work for those who find themselves sleeping rough. If you are in need of this support, please visit the cafe on a Monday, Wednesday or Friday and speak to one of our support team.

Exmouth & District u3a online - our digital world


