- Lyme Regis Fossil Hunting

Bristol Harbourside - 24th April 2024

We have hired a coach to take us to Bristol Harbourside. It's a very interesting place to visit with lots of history. You will be dropped off near SS Great Britain which will leave you free to discover this area and the Bristol Harbourside. For those wishing to visit SS Great Britain, entrance is £22 per person and this entrance fee is not included in our ticket price. Within the locality you can visit the M Shed, which is a local history museum and entrance is free of charge, walk around the harbour side, take a ferry across the river which then gives you access to the Cathedral, Aquarium, Science Museum and many historic buildings. There is an abundance of eating places, all within walking distance. You are free to make your own discoveries. We will supply a map for this event to help you plan your day. The coach will pick you up at 9.30 am from the Exmouth Coach Park which is behind Exmouth train station, and we aim to return to the coach park, by 6 pm.

Health and safety considerations. The harbourside is mostly on a flat walking surface, but as it's an historic dock site, there are cobblestones, railway tracks and many obstacles.

Lyme Regis and Fossil Hunting including entry to the Museum - 23rd May

Trip to Lyme Regis and an opportunity to go on a fossil hunting expedition 23rd May 2024.

We have planned a day out to Lyme Regis museum. The coach will drop us off at the Lyme Regis museum in the morning. From there you are free to explore local history and of course the fossils. Here, Lyme's local history is well represented by its fantastic collections of fossils, maritime and domestic objects. While fossils play a big part in Lyme's history, it is also the birthplace for many literary and artistic people. In the afternoon we have organised a fossil hunt with a local expert and you can learn a little more about Mary Anning and her amazing discoveries and hopefully unearth your own fossils. This fossil exploration hunt is a three hours long expedition and included in the ticket price. This afternoon activity can only accommodate 30 people. For those not joining the fossil hunt in the afternoon, Lyme Regis is an interesting town to explore. The coach will pick us up at the Exmouth coach park, behind Exmouth Train station, at 9.30 am and return us there for 6pm.

Health and safety considerations. The fossil hunt is located on a beach. It will take place regardless of the weather. The ground can be uneven and slippery. Lyme Regis is a Hilly small town.

Social Committee Excursions

Before arranging any event, the social committee research facts relating to health and safety in order to fully support our members. Any particular issues relating to health and safety are listed on our webpage as well as included on your ticket. However, it cannot be too strongly stated that members must take into account their own capabilities before joining groups and excursions. In addition, members must ensure they wear suitable apparel and walking aids to meet all weathers and ground conditions.

New Group - Jam Band

The aim of this new group is to give players at all levels the opportunity to perform songs with, and for, each other. 'Songs' refers to instrumentals as well as those with vocals.

Group members can nominate songs in any style they'd like to play in advance. Then we'll try to fill sufficient roles to play those songs for the group. Alternatively, group members might choose to team up in advance to play songs for the group. The line-ups might vary from a solo performer, duo, trio, and up to full bands with vocals, drums, bass guitar, keyboards and brass etc.

There is the opportunity for members to choose a role that might vary from vocals, a simple 'play along' role, a rhythm backing role and up to taking a leading role with solos and improvising. This is to allow players with a wide range of abilities to participate.

The Jam Band can also function as a way of bringing together musicians with similar interests who wish to play together. The aim is to have fun performing music together, and to share knowledge in a constructive supportive environment. Sometimes great music will be created, and sometimes things will go wrong, which will all add to the fun.

Members interested in a particular group should check with the group organiser as to availability. Where groups are full, there may well be a waiting list in operation.

Simply arriving at a group activity unexpectedly and unannounced is not good practice or acceptable.

Our new Exmouth & District u3a website

We have some exciting news! We now have a new website. And it works well on all devices – computers, laptops, tablets and smartphones. There are currently two ways to see it:

- If you go to our old website, you will see a message at the top saying that this website will now longer be updated and inviting you to go to our new website by clicking or tapping on this link immediately below that message - <u>New Exmouth & District u3a website</u>. That will take you straight through.
- 2. Better still, you can visit our new website direct by clicking or tapping on the new website address link here (or typing this into your browser): https://exmouthu3a.online. If you have saved the website address for our old website (in your Bookmarks, Favourites, or as a shortcut on your home screen on your computer/tablet/mobile phone), you may wish to replace this with this new website address, and you may want to save this even if you have not done this before. How to save this new website address depends on your device and your browser. If you've no idea what I am talking about, try a Google search about this or better still ask a teenager to show you!

The background to this as most members will be aware is that our current website, like those of the majority of u3as, is hosted by the u3a nationally, and this hosting arrangement with the current website platform comes to an end this year. We were also aware that the old website was unreliable and the website itself was old and looked dated. So last year we formed a small u3a Website Project Group of volunteer u3a members which included Graham Wood (who is also the Group Organiser of our u3a Website Developers Group) and Nigel Day (who is also Membership Secretary), with additional support from lan McLauchlin.



Having evaluated the options open to us, we felt that the best way forward was to create our own website, thereby giving us complete control, but at the same time draw from the work that has been done nationally in creating a new u3a website template using a highly respected website platform called WordPress. So that is what we have done, with Graham and Nigel using their extensive knowledge, expertise, experience and creative genius, and you can see the results for yourselves. A huge thank you to Graham and Nigel for the enormous amount of hard work they have put into this project over the past few months.

I am continuing as the Website Manager for both the old website (although its content will no longer be updated) and the new website. And I'm delighted to say that John Parker has kindly volunteered to join me as Deputy Website Manager for the new website.

To help guide you round the new website I have created a video giving you a short tour of the website which should help familiarise you on how to find you way round and show you what's different and what's new.
