## **MATHS TEASER**

How did you get on with solving the Maths teaser in the April newsletter? I do know a few of you managed to do it and, in fact, found the question straightforward. That's good. I shall have to see if I can find some more challenging questions for such clever folk. For those of you who were not able to solve the problem a reminder of the problem plus a solution now follows.

### Question

A basic cookie dough mix requires butter, sugar, flour and chocolate chips.

- $\frac{1}{6}$  of the mix is butter
- $\frac{1}{3}$  of the mix is sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$  of the mix is chocolate chips
- The rest of the mix is flour

Calculate the fraction of the mix that is flour.

#### Solution

Add the three fractions together by changing to a common denominator

$$\frac{1}{6} + \frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{4}$$

Or

$$\frac{\frac{2}{12} + \frac{4}{12} + \frac{3}{12}}{\frac{9}{12} = \frac{3}{4}}$$

Subtract ¾ from 1 to get the answer

$$1 - \frac{3}{4} = \frac{4}{4} - \frac{3}{4} = \frac{1}{4}$$

This month's Maths teaser is also taken from the 2019 National 5 Applications of Mathematics Paper 1. The question is in the non-calculator paper so you should not use a calculator to solve the question. Neither should you go on the Internet to find the solution. All the very best. I will provide the solution next month.

#### Question

Write the following values in order from greatest to least.

$$0.388, \frac{3}{8}, 38.38\%, 0.39$$


### Art Collection at the University of Stirling
