Maths Teaser

How did you get on with the maths teasers in the August Newsletter? The questions were a bit tricky and required you to have some specific maths knowledge as I will show in the solutions.

Question 1

What does $3^0 + 4^{-1} =$

This question requires that you know that any number raised to the power of zero equals 1. Don't worry if you did not remember this as most of the students I teach don't remember it either. The question also requires that you know that any number raised to -1 is one divided by the number. The solution to the question is, therefore, as follows:

$$3^0 + 4^{-1} = 1 + \frac{1}{4} = 1\frac{1}{4}$$

Question 2

What does $\sqrt{81} - 3! =$

Hopefully you remembered that the square root of 81 is 9. The 3! is 3 factorial and simply means $3 \times 2 \times 1 = 6$. Thus, the solution is as follows:

$$\sqrt{81} - 3! = 9 - 6 = 3$$

To begin the 2023-24 session, I will start you off with a fairly simple question from the 2023 National 5 Applications of Mathematics Paper (non-Calculator). All the very best.

Problem

Janet travelled by car from her home to a meeting. She arrived at the meeting at 10:15 am. She travelled 136 miles at an average speed of 40 mph. During the journey she stopped for 50 minutes for breakfast. <u>Determine the time Janet left home</u>.
