As the number of scams continue to increase, as anyone can be a victim of a scam, it is important to stay alert and follow our guidance.

This advice is received from Kent Police or Kent County Council Public Protection

Reputable traders and contractors do not cold-call for business and they will NEVER ask you to go to the bank or cash point.

If you receive a scam phone call, hang up and don't return their calls.

NEVER disclose any personal information such as bank details, no matter who the person claims to be.

Cold Caller Alert

Kent Police have received information of cold callers in the Dartford area impersonating HMRC personnel using fake ID badges. These criminals may be operating in other areas in Kent so please be alert.

They state you owe money to HMRC and try to get you to pay in person or via a telephone number. If you're concerned about someone calling at your home, don't open your door. Do not engage with anyone impersonating HMRC as they do not conduct home visits.

Any concerns report a non-urgent crime online or talk to Kent Police on LiveChat – available 24/7. If you think that you may have been a victim of this, then contact your bank immediately, which you can do by calling 159 Winter doorstep crime scams

For homeowners, the prospect of winter means a review of any work needed to make sure your home is watertight and prepared for any possible storm. Doorstep Criminals know this, and will be looking to target you.

They will knock at your door and offer: Gutter cleaning, Roof repairs or cleaning, Driveway cleaning or maintenance, Tree felling or garden work. They use high-pressure or scare tactics and tell you they can do it for a good price - but only if you agree now. The work they carry out will be overpriced, unnecessary and of poor quality Never agree to have work done by cold callers.

Plan now, what work do you need? - Find a safe local trader using Trading Standards Checked Get three quotes, Look out for neighbours and friends, report any cold callers to Kent Police on 101.

Fake Toys

Did you know that fake toys often have toxic chemicals?

One of the most common toxic metals found in counterfeit toys is lead. Lead exposure is particularly dangerous for children, as their brains and nervous systems are more sensitive to lead's harmful effects. Fake toys are also made with low-quality materials which often contain loose parts or sharp edges. Giving fake toys to children could have serious consequences, and could lead to choking, burns, damage to hearing, or even strangulation.

If you have information about fake products, tell CrimeStoppers what you know. You stay 100% anonymous. Always. No one will know you've spoken up, but what you tell us could make a big difference.
