As the number of scams continue to increase, as anyone can be a victim of a scam, it is important to stay alert and follow our guidance.

This advice is received from Kent Police or Kent County Council Public Protection

- * Reputable traders and contractors do not cold-call for business, and they will NEVER ask you to go to the bank or cash point.
- * If you receive a scam phone call, hang up and don't return their calls.
- * NEVER disclose any personal information such as bank details, no matter who the person claims to be. Get free advice from Citizens Advice 0808 223 1133

LATEST SCAM INFORMATION FROM KCC

Residents have reported two men knocking on doors in Dover offering to clear blocked drains. They were also asking questions about whether the residents lived alone.

Ever received a letter demanding payment from a solicitor, not meant for you?

A Kent resident has reported receiving letters from a solicitor. The request for payment was due to an incident where petrol was not paid for at a filling station. The letters threatened a CCJ (County Court Judgment). If it wasn't paid, they would be sending bailiffs to the property. While this was an error, the resident did not want bailiffs at his home. After repeated attempts to contact the solicitor, they still haven't heard back.

This could be a scam to try and get you to pay money or identity theft where a fraudster using your personal details to commit offences.

After winning on the site, they were unable to withdraw their funds or their deposit. When they tried to contact the support, no one has responded, and resident has lost their deposit money and winnings.

Recognising a scam website:

- you suspect you're not dealing with a real company for example, if there's no postal address
- you've been asked to transfer money quickly
- you've been asked to pay in an unusual way for example, by iTunes vouchers or through a transfer service like MoneyGram or Western Union
- you've been asked to give away personal information like passwords or PINs
- you haven't had written confirmation of what's been agreed

Membership fees for 2024/25

Any current member who has not paid by the end of April will be removed from membership of our U3A and any groups you might have been a member of.

Finally, could I ask that those who have not completed a Gift Aid form for your membership fee, you consider doing so, as it increases our income by 25% at no cost to the individual (but you do have to be a UK taxpayer), I will happily supply forms if required (or they are available on our website).
