Dear Kent Residents,

As the number of scams continue to increase, as anyone can be a victim of a scam, it is important to stay alert and follow our guidance.

This advice is received from Kent Police or Kent County Council Public Protection

Reputable traders and contractors do not cold-call for business and they will NEVER ask you to go to the bank or cash point.

If you receive a scam phone call, hang up and don't return their calls.

NEVER disclose any personal information such as bank details, no matter who the person claims to be.

LATEST SCAM INFORMATION FROM KCC

Kent Police report numerous reports of **Courier Fraud** in Dover, Canterbury and Tunbridge Wells – Residents have now lost £5,000 to courier fraudsters in Canterbury and Tunbridge Wells – please warn and inform friends and family. Reports state residents receive a call from the Police and they either need to give their address for a courier to come and get their bank card or money. The scam can change from having a family member arrested or that fraud has been place taken place on your account. These are all scams. The police never make calls like this. Check the dialing tone after your call to ensure scammers are not still on the phone, use another telephone, if possible ,to call 999 or call a trusted friend first. If a courier arrives at your property ring 999. If you think you may have been a victim of this or any other type of scam, then contact your bank immediately (call 159) and report it to Action Fraud www.actionfraud.police.uk or 0300 123 2040/

Scam Christmas Fair targeting Kent Residents

Often posted on Facebook, it is an invitation to stallholders to book a place. Once the money is taken their post disappears leaving the stallholder out of pocket. This is a scam. The Cost of Living means many want to make a little more money by selling homemade crafts, but before paying money ensure they are genuine, check with the venue. Air Fryer Scam emails

Action Fraud has received 468 reports in two weeks relating to fake emails claiming to be from Asda. Watch out for these SCAM emails claiming you've won a free air fryer. The websites the emails link to are designed to steal your contact info and payment details. Report suspicious emails by forwarding them to: report@phishing.gov.uk
