For members not on email paper copies are available at the main meeting.



This month [March] we visited Kings Mill reservoir to see if we could add any more species to our list. The day started off with a light drizzle which had stopped by the time we were on our way back towards the café. The highlights of our visit were a total of 7 Shoveller ducks and seeing the Heron colony. In all we saw a total of 31 species of which we added 3 more to our list.

Pauline continued with her quest to sort her many photographs into order, we looked at creating new

folders and transferring photographs from one folder to another and renaming the folders and photos, a time consuming task but well worth it when completed. We also looked at copying and pasting text from a document to an email or vice versa on the Apple ipad, this was something new for me with my recently acquired ipad and thanks to Google, trial and error, plus Anita and Maureen we worked it out and I am now a wiser man.

#### Computer Group 2.

Three members and myself met at the Prince Charles on Thursday 17 <sup>th</sup>, March, we looked at downloading documents and printing them, the crucial part of this exercise is to make a note of the folder the computer downloads to (usually the downloads folder!) and making a note of the file name so we know what we are looking for, we also looked at transferring photos from a phone to a laptop.

Rambling

Rambles from 7 miles up to 9 miles on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of each month.

On 2<sup>nd</sup> March the group set off from Carsington village to encounter just about every type of weather in one day. After an initial steep climb in good weather in the direction of Harboro Rocks we looked forward to fine views from that elevated position. After crossing the High Peak Trail light snow descended; as we approached the highest point the snow came at us horizontally, the view obscured in a "white-out". Weather improving, we walked on to explore Brassington.

On route we paused to watch a mesmerising display by a male Rhea, a large flightless bird related to the Ostrich that raced around its mate at break-neck speed interspersed by bobbing and jumping.

On a bright sunny 16 <sup>th</sup> March we parked in Monyash, a pleasant limestone village with a church founded in the 12<sup>th</sup> century, once the centre of lead mining in this locality and where the Barmote Court met to settle lead mining disputes. A walled track led up to pastureland and to the farm at One Ash Grange, once used by the monks of Roche Abbey. Here we passed by ancient pigsties and a cave, possibly once used for cold storage, before dropping down through Cales Dale into Lathkill Dale. This marvellous dale, initially with limestone cliffs, was continually changing character as we proceeded downstream for 2 miles , with crystal clear water and much evidence of lead mine workings in the dale. Further downstream we

passed stone columns crossing the dale, remains of an aqueduct which served an engine house beside the river.

We left the dale at Lathkill Lodge and climbed the lane to Over Haddon for lunch. Moving on, now on high pastureland and looking behind to admire the extensive views, we reached Magpie Mine, a former lead mine which closed in 1953. Everyone was rather surprised by the small size of the headstock — after all, we are all used to the Clipstone Colliery headstocks, monsters in comparison! After inspecting the ruins we set off on the return leg over the fields back to Monyash, to finish the day with a drink and/or cuppa at the Bulls Head in the village. What a lovely day out on a warmer day than of late.

Our next rambles will be Alstonefield, Wolfscote Dale & Hartington (Wed 6<sup>th</sup> April, 8¾ miles), followed by Bonsall, Wensley Dale & Bonsall Moor (Wed 20<sup>th</sup> April, 8½ miles), meeting up at Arena car park to organise lift sharing and to depart at 08:40 am. New members always welcome, if interested in rambling why not ask about them at the monthly meeting?
