

LOOKING BACK to our SEPTEMBER MEETING

Peter Hammond gave a very interesting talk about Nottinghamshire born Albert Ball VC. Letters that Albert had written, (many of them to his father) over the the years were central theme of



the talk. Most of which are retained in Nottinghamshire Archives.

We learnt about Albert's family life, his father, (also named Albert) was a well known person in his own right becoming a Mayor of Nottingham and later being knighted. Albert had two older sisters Hilda and Lois also a younger brother Arthur Cyril.

Peter emphasised various sections of the letters which were sent when he was at school, Albert was educated at Lenton Church School, Grantham Grammar School and Trent College in Long Eaton.

He joined the 'Officer Training Corp' when at college which stood him in good stead when he enlisted in the Sherwood Foresters in 1914 at the age of 18.

Albert decided to learn to fly and gained the relevant qualifications which enabled him towards the beginning of 1916 to transfer to the RFC (Royal Flying Corps). Throughout all this time letters continued to be sent home and not only did we learn about his military life but also his social and love life - it seems he was fond of the ladies!

Much is recorded about his flying career and that he became one of Britain's top scoring pilots. He was awarded the Military Cross with DSO's.

Sadly Albert Ball was killed in an air fight on the 17th May 1917. He was posthumously award the Victoria Cross and his medal was presented to his parents by King George V on 22nd July 1917.

It was disappointing members were not given the opportunity to ask Peter questions after his talk, I am sure there would have been many.

We now live in an age when people use mobile phones and the internet rather than write letters which suggests that such a talk will not be possible in the future!

Has anyone thought of starting a Cookery Group? If so here is a recipe they might like to try!

BRANDY CAKE

1 cup of butter 4 large eggs
1 cup of sugar 1 tsp baking powder

1 cup of dried fruit Lemon Juice

1 cup of brown sugar 1 Bottle of Brandy

METHOD

Sample the brandy and check for quality. Take a large bowl. Check the brandy again to be sure it is of the highest quality. Pour one level cup and drink. Repeat. Turn on electric mixer. Beat one cup of butter and beat again, make sure the brandy is still OK. Cry another tup. Turn off the mixer. Break two leggs and add to the bowl then chuck in the cup of dried fruit. Mix on the turner. Sample the brandy again to check tonsistincity. Next sift two cups of salt (or something who cares?). Check the brandy. Now sift the lemon juice and strain your nuts. Add one babble spoon of brown sugar, or whatever colour you can find. Wix mel. Grease the oven. Turn the cake pall to 350 gredees. Do not forget to beat off the turner. Throw the bowl out of the window, check the brandy again and go to bed.
