A memorial walk is being planned in conjunction with all the other U3As in the Mansfield area on Tuesday 30th June 2020.

Most likely it will start at the White Gates Hotel in Forest Town and end with a drink there. It will be an opportunity for ramblers and short walks groups from U3As around Mansfield to walk together, share anecdotes and memories of Alan, and to celebrate his legacy.

Family History

At the start of the meeting Ann and Chris walked in with two small rolls of carpet, was this some new way of transporting family trees we wondered? No, it turned out that they'd just bought them on the way to Flint Ave. however see further down.....

This month we had a general chat session about what had been discovered since the last meeting. Malcolm had been busy keeping Pauline off Find my Past by looking into one of his lines. This had thrown

up some questions, why was Leonard born in North Kensington when his parents came from Sheffield and where was the family in 1891? Also why was he living with his grandmother in Sheffield in 1901 but there was no sign of his parents who seemed to have vanished off the face of the earth? We all put our heads together to come up with suggestions for him to try.

This kind of mystery often occurs in Family History (we've all got them) and can be very frustrating, sometimes it can be that people are living with a relative, may be in the Workhouse or have disappeared for reasons best known to themselves, it doesn't mean the end of the line though and often some lateral thinking can unearth further information that may solve the mystery, you just have to keep plugging away.

I've had a similar problem with my great aunt, the difficulty here is that she (and her husband) often changed their names, Elsie or Ethel Madge to Madge Ethel and possibly Marjorie and is he Percy William, William Percy or some other combination? No one left to ask, so according to the group I'm just going to have to bite the bullet and order the marriage certificate for William P Oldfield to Marjorie E Frost in 1922, in Derby, not Doncaster, and hope it's the right couple!

Now back to the carpet rolls, Mick was not aware of directories, available in Archives and libraries, and how they can help to fill in the years between census returns about where our ancestors were living, and sometimes occupations, if they owned a shop at the time. Pauline had brought along some directories for him to have a look at, one of which was very large and very old so you don't want to be opening it and allowing the rest to flop about, one of the carpet rolls fitted the bill nicely as a support, not what you get in the Archives but beggars can't be choosers.

Our meeting this month was a hands on discovery session looking at maps. Pauline had brought a large variety relevant to Forest Town and Mansfield. Guest U3A member Allan Barham also brought a large map (on a board) of Mansfield which needed dating. This map had the names of shops etc. on it that was in living memory and this sparked a lot of conversation. Some of the maps Pauline brought despite being in a very delicate condition proved of great interest, they showed Mansfield and Forest Town. These plus

some of the others needed weighting down as they had been rolled up. Not having the type of weights to be found in archives, alternatives had to be found and Pauline brought along glass paper weights, tins of fruit amongst other things - these caused a smile but did the job.



Among the other maps were some showing before and after Forest Town was built which are very intriguing to see how the village was built in the field patterns. One map was of Forest Town (circa 1950) when planning for the Prince Charles pub was underway and the area it was anticipated it would cover. There was paper work to go with this revealing how petitions were got up from those who wanted and didn't want a public house in the village. The planning of the Mansfield Railway map (early 1900's) revealed many of the owners of properties en route. We had a break for refreshments and chat, but soon everyone was back to poring over the maps. We do not have a meeting in December. Our next meeting is Thursday 16th January 2.15pm when (hopefully) everyone will have brought along some aspect of local history they have found on the internet that has interested them. Pauline

Carol led our first walk in November from Rowsley on a cold morning with mist clinging to the bottom of the Derwent Valley. After a steady incline we arrived at Stanton Woodhouse, with its 16th century manor house where a startled deer dashed across our path. In woodland displaying beautiful autumn golden hues we came across the disused Lees Cross quarry, which has the highest quarry face in the UK, before arriving at the Nine Ladies standing stone circle. The walk over Stanton Moor afforded wide views. Several unsuccessful attempts were made to climb the Cork Stone. Luckily no-one was injured. Dropping off the moor to Congreave, we had views over Haddon Hall before the weather closed in for the final leg back to

Rowsley.



Steve's walk from Eakring first took us to Mompesson's Cross, marking the site where Mompesson preached on becoming the village Rector in 1670 A.D. after leaving Eyam which had been decimated by the plague. Then we headed for Dukes Wood, the unlikely site of an oilfield which operated in secret during the Second World War, keeping Britain moving when German U-boats were sinking oil tankers coming from the USA.



Our coffee break was interrupted by a herd of highland cattle passing by to fresh pasture. Lunch was taken at a view point above Maplebeck, although it was too hazy to see the promised view of Lincoln cathedral. Our walk back to Eakring over ploughed fields was tough going, our boots caked in mud and heavy.

Our next rambles: 4th December: Short walk from Cromford followed by Christmas lunch (around 4.5 miles) 18th December: Cuckney & Church Warsop (8.2 miles). Meet at the Arena car park to arrange lift sharing, normally departing at 08:40 a.m. prompt but please check beforehand. New members welcome.
