Key messages to ensure you continue to drive safely included choosing a route to avoid difficult junctions and 'the two-second rule'. By keeping a minimum of a two second time gap in front of your vehicle (double in poor weather) you will create space in which to react to any emergency that happens ahead.

1028 and all that!?

When you say to people that you are researching your family history, they often ask: "How far back have you got?" Well, most of us will say early 1800s or late 1700s, if we are lucky!. However one member of our Trace Your Family History group, Ann Alcock, surprised us all this March by bringing along one line of her family tree that went back way beyond the 1700s.

This family tree was produced on a scroll, well, a roll of analypta lining paper that cost under £5, and it was beautifully presented with brief information of each person written on sticky labels. Where possible, the whole tree had been beautifully illustrated.

The first name on this tree was Ann Woods, (her maiden name) born 1958, she then followed her father's line through to grandparents, great grandparents and great, great grandparents. There were photographs for most of them. Ann had worked back through the census and other records also on the Ancestry web site, checking that the website's information was correct as she went along.

The tree continued by linking with French families in the 1600s. These were illustrated with coats of arms. Further back there was John Talbot 4th Earl of Shrewsbury and Joan Fitzalan of Arundel (Ann's 20th x Great Grandmother). Eventually it stopped with William the Conqueror in 1028. It was just amazing!

To trace her family history, Ann had also used Open links to Millennium Files and Netherlands Genealogy Online as well as Internet research, Wikipedia etc. Most

of us had not heard of the two former sources and they were something else for us all to try.

Additional to this most intriguing family tree Ann had individual files for

each generation. At least six years of work had gone into all this.

Coming back to earth we had a new lady join us who would like to confirm the information she has been told that she is related to Sir Jesse Boot. Time was spent showing her how to go about this and where she can find information when she does not have a computer.

We recently heard a comment by someone thinking about joining the group that she thought we would all be tapping away on computers at the meeting. We realise this may be a misunderstanding that others also make. The fact is there

is only one member who always bring his computer (I think its fastened to his wrist!). You don't need a computer to start your family history, just a notebook and pencil and your glasses!!


The group did a stroll round part of the lake. It was so nice to see so many people of all ages out and about in the park.
