Time to renew your membership

The Executive Committee has reviewed the budget for the next financial year and has set the annual membership renewal fee at £19.00. Associate members, those who are already members of another branch of the u3a, can renew for £15.00.

An increase in fees is regrettable but necessary. The Third Age Trust, the national body which oversees all UK u3a branches, will charge around £9 for each member. For this, our u3a gets insurance cover for our activities, use of the membership database, distribution of the Third Age Matters magazine, access to training material and technical support for any problems we encounter.

That leaves us just £10 per member to pay for the 12 monthly general meetings and the administration of your u3a.

There are three ways of paying your membership fee:

Bank transfer.

is classed as a business bank account. **Note, it is a** different bank account to the one you pay your trip money into.

Cheque.

These should be made out to FOREST TOWN & DISTRICT U3A, with your membership number on the reverse. Bring your cheque along to the meetings in February/March or post to K Cope, 97 Lingforest Road, Mansfield, Nottinghamshire, NG18 3NO.

If you are unable to pay by bank transfer or cheque then you can pay in cash at the next two monthly meetings on 3rd February 2023 and 3rd March 2023. PLEASE AVOID CASH PAYMENTS IF YOU CAN.

The closing date for renewals is Friday 12 May 2023.
