Ramblers find some Spring sunshine at last!

Our first outing in May took place on a lovely Spring day. We soon shed a layer of clothing as we left Ashford in the Water and made our way to Great Longstone on firm grassy paths in the sunshine.

A leisurely morning drinks break was taken on the village cricket ground, basking in the warmth. After a steady climb to Monsal Head, we dropped steeply into Monsal Dale where we followed the River Wye, taking our lunch break on its bank watching the ducks and coots on the water.

A dauntingly long and steep climb on a rough path up Deep Dale rewarded us with panoramic views at the top and the picturesque village of Sheldon. From there it was a lovely downhill stroll to Ashford, then onto the café in the grounds of Thornbridge Hall.

We were blessed with fine warm weather on our second outing too from Gradbach on the Staffordshire/ Cheshire border.

This walk was full of variety, on

woodland paths with swathes of bluebells, along a high ridge with distant views on either side and a rugged trail along the River Dane valley.

The highlight was the path through Lud's church, a deep chasm penetrating the Millstone Grit bedrock created by a massive landslip on a hillside. This

chasm has a place in Christian history: the Lollards, who were followers of John Wycliffe, an early church reformer, used this as a secret place of worship during the early 15th century, when they were being persecuted for their religious beliefs.
