

How to restore your keyboard to the UK English version.

Sometimes, (usually occurring after a Microsoft update), you may find your keyboard has changed to the U.S. keyboard layout, causing the annoying problem of the @ and £ sign keys being assigned to a different key.

To change the keyboard back to the UK English layout try this keyboard shortcut first, press and hold down the Windows key, (3rd from left on bottom row with the microsoft logo on it), now press the spacebar and a box should pop up on-screen showing the keyboard language, still holding the windows key down press and release the spacebar and it will toggle between the options in the popup box, select the option you want and release the windows key, (this sometimes proves to be a temporary fix).

A quick way to the Language settings menu is to type Language in the search box and press Enter, you can change the language setting there.

If these methods don't work for you open Settings by typing Settings in the search box or by clicking on the Settings icon, (the little cog wheel above the on/off icon), this will take you to the Settings menu, look for Time and Language (speech,region,date) in the options, click on this option and then select Region and language and change the language setting, close the settings window and you should be OK.
