As we all know, members of the u3a are a very friendly bunch – but getting that message across to potential new members can be a difficult task – especially to those who may be a little reserved or out of the habit of socialising.

Michael Dobbs, a member of Calverton & District u3a decided to try a new tack – producing a short promotional video showing members en-

joying a wide range of group activities. Of course, the Data Protection Act means that everyone appearing in the video had to give permission - fortunately after a promise that any wrinkles would be removed in post-processing, everyone agreed to be recorded.

After filming at over 15 different group meetings, it was time to put together a presenter script that covered all the points we wanted to get across – using the very minimum of words to keep the video duration as short as possible. With a little persuasion, two of our members, Jude Cordell and John Suggett, agreed to act as presenters, and put themselves through the ordeal of appearing on camera whilst sticking to a script. I think you'll agree that they both did very well!

Editing the material brought its own difficulties, not least finding a suitable copyright-free piece of music (the production budget was £0) with the required duration to fit the visuals. To make the video more accessible, chapter points and subtitles were added to the edit.

After uploading the finished edit to YouTube, a link was put on our website homepage, and promoted on all of the local Facebook pages.




The Gardening Group once again had the return of an excellent Speaker, Janet from
