Secondly, and I think importantly, is the musical direction we collectively want to take. There were some mixed thoughts floating yesterday and it seems important to get these discussed. From memory there is a variety of instruments as well as mixed ability. What was clear was the enthusiasm to play together so I'm guessing finding the right start point and level will be important if we want to succeed.

If we have a better understanding of our style and experience before we meet up it might help with a startpoint for discussing ideas. If everyone is happy to circulate a brief outline of their musical experience it might help?

A little about my musical style: I've played 5 string banjo in the Clawhammer style for 7 or 8 years and consider I 'practice' rather that 'play' the banjo. This is a little know style and it's doubtful you will have heard much about it. I normally play a style called 'Old Time American' but occasionally try other things. This style doesn't readily lend itself to general group playing so a few months ago I joined the local Ukulele group in Garforth (GULP): very much a novice but keen to improve. Here's a banjo Christmas tune I've been practicing.

The big question is how best to bring together our musical diversity into a single group? I'm guessing the only way is to 'try' but it may help to know what we expect from our group and what music to try. From my point of view, I suggest picking a couple tunes for everyone to get familiar with, tunes we can all agree on. Then when we get together we might be able develop our style before stretching ourselves: but that's just me! Let's get some thoughts to discuss before our meeting.

I have no experience of playing music with others and have no idea where to start but, I'm sure together we can find an approach that will suit us all. One of the things I take from the U3A ethos is 'learning' and I get the impression we all want to learn something new.

One other thing worth mentioning is something said yesterday. We might have a chance to use a Garforth hall on for weekday practice: fingers-crossed for this as somewhere large enough for us get to together without disturbing others sounds perfect. Important because I suspect there will be discordant musical experimentation before we find our 'groove'!
