

RICHARD HUDSON NELSON 1893 - 1916

Richard Hudson Nelson was one of 8 children born to Albert Nelson and Alice (nee Smith).


He was born in Kendal in 1893 but moved with his family to Grange sometime around 1899.

At that time Grange was beginning to develop as a town and tourist resort and as such attracted opportunities for skilled men.

Census records indicate that all the males in the Nelson family possessed occupations relating to building work.

In the 1911 census Richard, was recorded as a joiner, as was his father and brothers, except for Victor who was a stonemason.

As the advertisement taken from the Red Book for 1911 shows, his father had already established a business in Grange advertised as joiner, builder, undertaker and stonemason, so it is highly likely that Richard worked in the business.



However, the outbreak of war intervened and in 1914 records show that Richard enlisted in Ulverston, joining the King's Own Royal Lancashire Regiment, 1st- 4th Battalion and was subsequently sent to the Western Front where he was killed on the 9th July, 1916.

UK SOLDIERS DIED IN THE GREST WAR 1914 -1918

This newspaper article written in the Westmorland Gazette at the time of his death describes the circumstances.

"It is believed he was killed by the explosion of a shell.

#

His companions gathered the men from Grange district together and they laid him to rest in a little village about a mile behind the trenches. Private Nelson was the fourth son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Nelson of East Bank Grange and formerly of Kendal.

He was just turned 23 years of age and was the cousin of Private Harry Nelson of Rose Cottage, Kendal who died from wounds last week. News was received of their fate almost simultaneously".


Records show that he was buried at Agny Military Cemetery, in France.


