- 2. Make any donations to a known charity or appeal. Check the website name when you make a payment. Again don't click on a link from another website or a link shared on social media.

And a final question for us to think about: If our credit cards or debit cards get stolen, do we have enough information on us to put a stop on them ASAP.

Well, firstly a big thank you to all of you who have taken the trouble to master using our Beacon membership system to amend your personal details and more importantly to renew your membership. This has greatly helped membership administration as we have not had to deal with processing 570 pieces of paper! That, coupled with not having to bank cash or cheques, makes for a much more efficient and secure system.

The requirement to create individual passwords has been problematic but this is a one-off event and most, but not all, have now done this. Access to your own membership record and online renewal in the future depends on a password being set.

In light of your comments and changes that have been implemented, we have honed any instructions we send out and believe we have a robust and reliable process that can be used by all. We just need to convince a few more of you to join in.

The biggest hurdle for online renewal still seems to be the belief that you need a PayPal account. You definitely do not but there is a background PayPal mechanism that Beacon uses to process your bank card transaction. Also, an option to automatically create a PayPal account has been sneaked in that you need to switch off by sliding the little blue dot to the left if you do not wish to do this.

Membership renewal can also be done at the Christmas Party on Tuesday 19th December at the Guildhall. Just bring your Bank Card!
