You may well have heard of Florence and seen headlines such as "Corby's familv's desperate bid to raise £500k for life-saving treatment for their little girl"

On May 13 she was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia and, because of her genetic makeup, her prognosis was grave as Florence's gene type meant she was at very high risk. A campaign was launched to get as many people as possible (under 30's) to sign up to the stem cell transplant register and to raise £500.000 should a stem cell transplant fail and the family has to seek expensive last-ditch treatment abroad.

Florence isn't allowed out of the hospital so her parents are being helped by a charity called Billy's House so they have somewhere to stay together in Nottingham.

There is another AML patient from Northampton on the same ward as Florence and the Barks are working with them to increase knowledge of the stem cell donation register.

The next step is a bone marrow She was first sent to Leicester transplant in around 5 weeks. There is no complete match on the register so everyone is hoping that the bone marrow transplant will work. If it doesn't work there is one possible lastchance route a Car T-Cell therapy where cells are taken from the patient and changed to attack cancer cells. Large numbers of the cells are grown and infused back into the patient's body but the treatment is not offered on the NHS and is incredibly expensive, costing up to £500.000.

If Florence is eligible for Car T-Cell, she may need to fly to Singapore for treatment.

Stacey and Andy launched their Just Giving campaign on social media to an absolutely overwhelming response from Corby people and £20,000 was raised in less than 12hrs and the fund now stands at well over £100,000.

Because Florence's leukemia is aggressive, time is of the essence. The family needs to get as many people as possible signed up to the blood stem cell donor register before a possible transplant in five or six weeks. Myeloid leukaemia is a guick-

developing type of cancer that affects blood-producing myeloid cells in the bone marrow (the spongy material inside some of our bones). It usually affects adults and only 100 children are diagnosed in the UK each year.
