# Introducing Committee Members – Helen Watts Our Membership Secretary

So, it looks like it is my turn this month to tell you a little bit about me.

I was brought up in Daventry and have an older brother. I desperately wanted to be a nurse and volunteered as part of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award at Danetre Hospital. I didn't become a nurse but that experience led to a lifetime of volunteering. I had many adventures as both brown owl and a scout leader (never did master knot tying, but am a dab hand at putting up a tent or campfire cooking) to name just two of the volunteering opportunities I have been privileged to be involved in. I moved to Northampton and met my husband Phil and we have been together more than 40 years. We have a son and daughter, together with a grandson and granddaughter. Coming from a large extended family, (Dad was one of 13 and Mum one of 8), family is everything to me.

Like many youngsters I started off working –life on Youth Opportunities Schemes, there wasn't much work in Daventry in the early 80's. Similar to Corby, I guess. I eventually settled into the legal profession before becoming a Mum. Later I joined local government where I became a union representative being particularly interested in equalities and diversity. My huge sense of justice and fair play does get me into trouble at times.

A medical injury meant I had to "retire" much earlier than planned and various events meant that, in 2015, it was time to look to our long-term future and we ending up moving to Weldon. We fell in love with Weldon and Corby and have built up a lifestyle and friendships that we both enjoy and couldn't

imagine being anywhere else now.

I am an avid family and local historian and run the new genealogy group. I enjoy introducing others to the world of family history, but there is always a proviso. We all have "skeletons" in our closets, but I feel it is not for us to pass judgement (there are exceptions, but I have yet to find any link to Jack the Ripper!). We can only scratch the surface of what their lives were like and can never walk in their shoes. Whatever the rights or wrongs of our ancestor's lives, we are here because of them and their struggles.

Kate thought she would tell you something about what they do. We start and end with meditation. The first is usually 15-20 minutes long and we finish with a shorter one. These are led by Rosemary who is very experienced in alternative therapies. We plan our sessions in 4-5-week blocks and the topics for discussion are agreed in advance. I am the organiser, but the presentation is shared between three of us; Rosemary I've already mentioned, I am a qualified CBT counsellor and have studied Mindfulness, and Cath has a Ph.D. in Child Development. Recent topics have been Mindfulness in Gardening, Crystal Healing and a future session will be on Sibling Rivalry. The idea is for group members to share their views and personal experience.
