

# KNOLE HOUSE, NR SEVENOAKS, WEDNESDAY, 19 JUNE, 2024 Price £25 (NT Members) or £40.20 Non-NT members Coach, Entry to Knole House with Past and Present tour and entry to Lord Sackville's private garden

Knole is a country house and former archbishop's palace owned by the National Trust near Sevenoaks in Kent. It is in the top five of England's largest houses and dates back to the mid-15th century, with major additions in the 16<sup>th</sup> and early 17<sup>th</sup> centuries. Its grade I listing was given because of its central façade and state rooms and its mix of latemedieval to Stuart architecture. In 2019, an extensive conservation project, "Inspired by Knole", was completed to restore and develop the buildings and conserve its major collections. Knole House is set in a 1000 acre deer park.

We have booked tickets for the Past to Present Tour which will take place in the morning with an expert guide, where we will explore the historic courtyards and hear about some of the main characters who have helped create this magnificent treasure house. This is an **outside walking** tour which does not go into the showrooms.

In addition, your visit includes tickets to visit Lord Sackville's private garden at Knole which is only open a few days every year. It is a beautiful space, featuring sprawling lawns, a walled garden, an untamed wilderness area and a medieval orchard.

Additional highlights, to do independently, of your visit are:

### Show rooms

Archbishop's palace, royal residence, and Sackville family home. Textiles, paintings and a world class collection of Royal Stuart furniture are exhibited there.

## **Gatehouse Tower**

Spiral stairs leading to the private apartments of former resident, Eddy Sackville-West, with panoramic views from the tower rooftop.

## The Royal Oak Foundation Conservation Studio

The major "Inspired by Knole" conservation project is sited in the magnificent medieval barn.

## Parkland

Kent's last medieval deer park which is managed along with the Sackville family's Knole Estate.

There should be time for coffee/tea (not included) upon arrival and you can either buy lunch at the café or bring your picnic to eat in the beautiful grounds.

It will be a very full day if you try to do everything. We will leave at 4.30 pm.
