#### **Chair's Introduction**

Meteorological summer may be officially over but, as seems typical this year, the weather gods are ignoring this and we look to be having and fine September (at last many of us are saying). A reminder that we've been able to declare September as a free month, so there's an opportunity to dip toes into an activity you might have considered trying at no cost.

We are delighted to see quite a few new members joining us over the past couple of months. If that includes you, you are most welcome. Our membership however is still well down on our pre-covid numbers. We will be holding a U3A information event on Tuesday, 19<sup>th</sup> September, between 10-12 in Sunnyfield House. It's an opportunity for curious members of the public to find out what we offer, for new members to find out more and existing members to explore different activities. The more members we have, the easier it is to hold down our subs and have more free months.

At the monthly meeting we were able to thank Carol Williams for her support over the last 5 years as our Website Manager. Particularly over the past year the work required to rebuild our website when the plug was pulled on our central U3A server without notice was a task and a half. Thanks again Carol. Ray Godfrey is our new Website Manager and he'll be managing the national upgrade of 'u3asites' when the software testing has been completed.

For a wider range of interests, U3A supports learning via "Interest Groups on-line". I must admit I was not familiar with this but the range of topics available is impressive including mainstream topics such as languages, history, science and current affairs to more niche topics such as British Cemeteries and Nordic Noir. We have also taken out group membership of the Holiday Fellowship. This allows members taking part in any HF holidays organised as part of a U3A group activity to avoid the £30 fee charged to non-HF members. It is particularly applicable to our walking groups but there are opportunities to take part in special interest breaks as well. (Please see the link at the end).

Some of you may be aware of the Repair Cafe which runs monthly in Stokesley using the library as a base. In our "throw-away society" they aim to help with simple repairs to give life to items we might throw away. Examples include sharpening of tools, electrical repairs and clothing repairs. A Guisborough Eco group has been formed to help provide information on how we can do our bit to help improve our environment. They want to start a Repair Cafe in Guisborough and the first event will be in the Methodist Church on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> September. This event will concentrate on providing free clothing repairs. The organisers want to expand the range of offerings and are interested to hear from anyone willing to offer their expertise for this. 
Creative Writing Workshop, for all abilities.
