Once again - Good News for all our members! No Increase in Membership Fees

No doubt you have read and heard about "shrinkflation", especially in supermarkets where the contents and pack sizes of popular brands have decreased whilst the price has gone up.

Wisley is also home to more than 140 Yoshino cherry trees, smothered in white to pale pink blooms. Let us hope that the weather is on our side and both the tulips and blossom will be showing in abundance.

Visit RHS Hilltop, the new centre and home of gardening science, wander through the many themed gardens and be amazed by the cathedral-like Glasshouse. Punctuate your day with refreshment visits to The Terrace Restaurant or Wisley Café and round off the day with a treat from the Garden Centre and Shop. The gardens cover a large area and it is recommended that comfortable footwear is worn.
