Most images found by a Google search will be subject to copyright and cannot be used without permission from the photographer or payment to the copyright holder. u3as are routinely contacted by companies who trawl the web looking for the misuse of these images and they will invariably issue fines. The images may have been found directly on the u3a's web pages or in a link to an old newsletter.

All members need to be vigilant and ensure there is no copyright infringement anywhere on our u3a website and in any usage of other published works. While it is the responsibility of your committee to ensure compliance, u3a H&E will be accountable if breaches have occurred.
