These scammers are getting very clever.

Please be very careful, especially now in the lead-up to Christmas. Don't forget to delete or check if something appears unusual or doesn't seem quite right.

There is, also, a growing interest in forming a second **Creative Writing** group. If you've always had an urge to write short stories, poems or even a novel, this group is ideal for you.





We learnt about the astonishing range of data sensed and transmitted by satellites, from wind profiles and ocean wave heights to atmospheric smoke pollution, and their deployment in planetary exploration and many other areas of critical science.

Steve's presentation included several fascinating videos produced by the European Space Agency and others. The debate which followed included discussions on GPS, Climate Change and global weather forecasting.
