Hot Issue Seminars (HIS) – The Group Leader, Chris Marsden, writes:

This group aims to hold a monthly seminar on hot issues of the day. During Covid we met through Zoom but have subsequently resumed meeting in members' houses and gardens. Each month one of our members researches and presents a short paper, which has been sent to group members for reading beforehand, on an issue they have chosen from a list agreed by the group. The group then discusses the issue with a view to reaching an evidence-based consensus on the nature of the problem(s) and recommended actions by government or whoever.

Among last year's topics were: Environment and the climate crisis, Artificial intelligence, Good economics for hard times, Meritocracy, 'Land ownership and trespass', China and world relationships, 'City, towns and villages post covid', The assault on truth, levelling up and the monarchy. The 2022/23 season began with 'Issues confronting the BBC' and then 'Ukraine'.

Given the nature of our discourse the optimum size of the group is probably 8 to 10. We are currently 13 but not everyone can make each meeting. MahJong - The MahJong group started a few years ago in response to Penny Turnbull's Chinese tour, when she'd been introduced to the game when on a cruise on the Yangtse river! She'd brought back a set of tiles, and wanted to find some people to play with. Along came others who'd tried the game briefly, plus one or two who had played as ex-pats, and some who were interested in just finding an activity which might involve use of a bit of grey matter!

To ensure Penny was playing correctly and would teach everyone correctly, she attended sessions at the Redbourn u3a group, and at Welwyn Garden City, and set off following the u3a rules, which are based on the British rules. One of the ex-pat players promoted some of the extra 'special hands' she'd played with in India, and so we now play strictly British rules on the 1st Wednesday of the month, and make use of an extended list of 'special hands' for the other weeks.

We play every Wednesday, and are lucky enough to make use of a room at the Salvation Army hall, making a donation of £2 per person each session for its use.
