Alfred was born in Havant, the son of Henry Elliott (1818-1895) and Charlotte nee Moore (1819-1888) Alfred was the 3<sup>rd</sup> of at least 8 children.

The 1861 census shows the family living in West Street, Havant, and the father's occupation is shown as shoemaker

Alfred married Martha Annie (nee Higgs) in 1880 at Portsea. Martha was born at Iron Acton, Gloucestershire

The 1881 census shows them living at 58 Lucknow Street, Portsea and Alfred is an unemployed house decorator

The 1891 census shows the family living at the Hearts of Oak public house, West Street, Havant, and Alfred is a plumber and painter

The children are Lilian Charlotte born 1881, Portsmouth

Alfred W born 1882, Portsmouth

Wilfred S born 1884, Portsmouth

Katherine Sarah born 1887, Havant

Arthur C born 1889, Havant

Frederick Augustus born 1892

Alfred died in 1893 aged 41

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### The 1901 census

The 1901 census shows Martha living at 440 Commercial Road, Portsea with Wilfred, a picture framer, Alfred W, a printer, Katherine and Frederick

Arthur is staying with relatives in Bristol

Lilian is a servant to a doctor in Alverstoke

### The 1911 census

The 1911 census shows Martha living at 4 King Street, Southsea, with Arthur, a shop assistant, and Frederick, a motor body builder apprentice

Lilian married Albert E Betteridge in 1909 and by 1911 was living in Dursley, Gloucestershire, with Albert and one child

Alfred was married to Sarah and living in Wandsworth with Sarah and two children, and was working as a deputy overseer of compositors

Wilfred is living in Soho, London, and working as a carver of dining rooms

Katherine is living in Lewisham, Kent, and working as a parlourmaid
