FUTURE OUTINGS

SHIBDEN HALL & HALIFAX PIECE HALL - CANCELLED - Due to accessibility issues at Shibden Hall, we have decided, regretfully, that for the time being this trip planned for the 10th August is not viable.

NEW VENUE for 10th August, Harewood House & Gardens, near Leeds. Harewood is in the heart of Yorkshire and is one of the Treasure Houses of England. The House was built in the 18th century and has art collections to rival the finest in Britain. It is home to an astounding collection of paintings by masters of the Italian Renaissance, family portraits by Reynolds, Hoppner and Lawrence, and modern art collected by the current Earl and Countess. Edward Lascelles was a patron of JMW Turner, who came here as a young artist aged just 22 to paint the new house and its landscape. Harewood House also has some of the most outstanding pieces of Chippendale furniture ever produced.

There are over 100 acres of gardens at Harewood. They are full of variety, with plants from all over the world. All this in the setting of a magnificent landscape created by Lancelot 'Capability' Brown. There is also a 'Farm Experience' where you can meet pygmy goats and alpacas! There's a large café, and picnic areas. Accessibility across the site is good, with a volunteer run shuttle service to the House from the main entrance, and most of the house is wheelchair accessible.

Entrance to the House & Gardens is £12.50 per person. The coach fare as always depends upon the number of people going but is likely to be around £13.
