General

Beware of spam emails! Hopefully we're all aware of spam emails coming from strangers – telling us that there is a package awaiting delivery (when we haven't ordered one) or our Amazon account is due for paying (but we don't use Amazon!). However, it has been brought to our attention that several u3as around the country are currently being targeted by scammers. These scammers are using the u3a's Exec Committee, and send emails that pretend to be from one of them. So a little more care needs to be taken now. These emails often just ask you to reply to acknowledge that you have received the email. If you respond, the spammer will then email you again, posing as the person you think they are, asking you for some sort of money. Most often they will ask you to buy a digital voucher on their behalf (e.g. Amazon or Apple) to be delivered to them. NEVER DO THIS!!!

Things to look out for are –

The email doesn't address you by name

It contains language that you know that person wouldn't use - e.g. "Hey!"

It contains American spelling or words or is poorly written

When in doubt, don't respond and never click on a link. If you think the email may be genuinely from the u3a member, contact them separately and check with them.

The Executive Committee (EC) would like to thank all of you who responded to the voting request concerning the method of issuing the HHD Handbook. 239 members voted in total. The result was that 69% of members voting were happy to receive future Handbooks by email attachment. 31% said they preferred to collect a printed copy.
