Dear Member,

Here is a report (as amended) of our meeting on 28 March 2022.

1. The meeting was well attended

There were thirteen attendees in the Baptist Hall and six via Zoom.

2. Presentation "Microsoft Windows 10 Photos and FastStone'

Andrew, thank you for presenting the features.

The principal features were;

Windows 10 Photos – has a range of editing tools such as, crop, resize, adjust colour etc, and is simple to learn.

FastStone (https://www.faststone.org/download.htm)) has many more editing tools for the more advanced user -> FastStone Image Viewer 7.5 - Photo editing - Download this one as well as other Apps available from that site:

- FastStone Capture 9.7
- A PC/laptop screen capture application
- FastStone MaxView 3.3
- View, adjust, resize and annotate images
- FastStone Photo Resizer 4.3 Image converter and renaming, photo editor that runs in Batch mode.

After each download you will be asked, but not obliged, to make a donation - I download all four applications and then donated \$15 which is £11.97

Do NOT download any FastStone applications from any other 'Free Software download site' as it might contain 'malware'

These two Photo editors were easier to use than Adobe Photoshop or Affinity photo, which required a great deal of learning and practice.

3.3 Critique of those photos that did not score any votes

The competition photos that did not score any votes were displayed without the photographer's name, to preserve anonymity.

- There will always be photos that do not score votes, i.e.
 - If 10 photos are submitted by 10 photographers
 - Each photographer has 1 vote, and 5 photographers vote for the same photo
 - Then there will be 4 photos that cannot receive any votes.
- General comments on those photos that did not receive any votes
 - No main point of interest, though might have been improved with cropping
 - There were distracting areas on the photo, e.g. white glare, bits of rubbish.
 - The vibrancy of colours or contrast was weak
 - The subject had little impact or interest.

6. Technical point - Sound quality of Laptop in Hall

Initially the HP laptop sound in the Hall was far too faint.

- It was much improved by coming out of Zoom,
- Going to Settings -> Sound -> Two speakers appeared to be present
- Selected each speaker in turn, adjust volume to 100 % and test
 - Best speaker in HP Laptop was 'Speaker (Realtek(R) Audio)

 The committee will consider and test a roving microphone
- 8. Technical point Some images will not fill Album Page or appear grainy
 Usually due to a small file size. An optimum size is 3600 Horizontal 2200 Vertical pixels.
 Can be improved by resizing to a larger file size and extra pixels will be interpolated between the original pixels.

If this has been a problem for you, you may wish to create your own test Google Album and add your own photos to see the effect.
