4. Backgrounds and Composition was the presentation by Len Fenton

Len presented us with a range of Backgrounds and Compositions, with examples, that we should consider when either taking or editing our images, such as; **Backgrounds**;

- Distractions Bright spots or lighted areas
- Protrusions Trees coming out of people's heads
- Effect of Lens Focal length, aperture, focus and framing
- Symmetry Often gives a pleasing result
- Unwanted Image spoilt with one or other person in the background
- Leading lines Help to conduct eye into the image
- No direction of eye The eye cannot concentrate on the main subject
- Check Background Reposition camera or subject to improve image
- Depth of field is greater with shorter focal length lens
- How to make subject stand out -
 - Subject is sharp and within depth of field
 - Blur the background perhaps with software, but do not overdo it.
 - Fill the frame

Composition

- Explanation of "Thirds, Golden Circle, Golden Triangle, Boken and paper sizes"
- With many funny examples of forced perspective, eg. Hands holding the
 "London Eye", "Propping up the Leaning tower of Pisa", Holding small people
 Search the Internet with "Forced perspective photos" for more examples.

We are perhaps fortunate that our images do not contain all the errors that one should try to avoid.

It was an excellent and very interesting presentation by Len. Thank you Len.

5. The Chesham Photo-shoot

Chesham was an excellent place for a photo-shoot. There were old village buildings dating from the 1700's, and a variety of shops that had been built since then. Also, there were interesting and amusing street scenes.
