1. Welcome

2. Presentation - Perspective by Brian Hillier

Brian showed examples of the five main types of perspective

- Linear - Dominant lines that lead to infinity

- Forced - Usually two objects placed apart result in humour

- Diminished - Objects of same height appear smaller in the distance

Overlapping - Areas that overlap are lighter in the distance

Atmospheric - The subject fades into fog or mist

Then these tips on how to achieve a three-dimensional effect on a flat surface

- Place the camera in a low or high viewpoint
- Try a new angle to change the composition
- Add depth with leading lines converging in the distance
- Place a strong object in the foreground as a focal point
- Include people to show a sense of scale
- Frame the subject with a doorway or overhanging tree branches
