Leonardslee is an English landscape and woodland garden in Lower Beeding, near Horsham, West Sussex, England. The Grade I listed garden is particularly significant for its spring displays of rhododendrons, azaleas, camellias, magnolias, and bluebells, with the flowering season reaching its peak in May. There are also a sculpture park for art enthusiasts, wallabies for animal lovers and even a Dolls House Exhibition.

Tuesday 11 June – Norwich

You have a free day to explore the city at your own pace. The city centre is easy to walk around and has a river at its heart. As well as being the most complete medieval city in the UK with stunning Norman Cathedral and Castle, it has a flourishing arts, music and cultural scene, superb independent as well as High Street shopping and a quaint covered market.

For art lovers, the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts, just a short bus ride away, is a genre-defying art museum with world-class collections and a unique perspective on how art can foster cultural dialogue and exchange.

Tuesday 16 July – Banbury & Broughton Grange

The morning is free to explore the lively town of Banbury on the river Cherwell with its charming streets and historic buildings alongside new developments - such as the Castle Quay Shopping Centre in the recently regenerated Oxford Canal area.

In the afternoon we head for Broughton Grange which won the European Garden Heritage Network award in 2018 for the best development of a historic park or garden. The centrepiece is an impressive three-terraced walled garden created by Chelsea gold medal-winning designer Tom Stuart-Smith. There are many other areas to see including a stumpery, woodland garden, knot garden, wildflower meadows, water meadow, parterre and rose garden and a large arboretum full of interesting trees.

Thursday 12 September – Bletchley Park

Immersive films, interactive displays, museum collections and faithfully recreated WW2 rooms will guide you on a journey to discover the past at Bletchley Park, the principal centre of Allied code-breaking during the Second World War. Exhibitions, set within beautifully restored historic buildings, tell the story of this once top-secret operation. Find out more about the brilliant minds and complex machines that made this vital work possible and discover the global impact Bletchley Park had on the outcome of WW2.
