
October – November including visit to Knappe Copse

In October the Group enjoyed a field trip to Knappe Copse Nature Reserve where thery were given a very informative guided tour by Wild East Devon Ranger – Jonathan Gardiner and his colleague Ben. They learnt that until the 1980's the site was a Refuse Tip. It is owned by Devon County Council but when it had come to the end of its use it was covered and 'Regenerated for Nature' and is now managed for nature and for people under the stewardship of East Devon Distict Council. It is a very diverse habitat and is home to a very large number of species including butterflies, moths, bees, birds, fungi and small mammals such as dormice. We visited the site in autumn, but this would be well worth another visit at a different time of year, say spring, as it is an ever changing picture!
