RECRUITMENT & RETENTION

It's a mixed bag for this bulletin as I've a few loose ends to tidy up before launching into the next Hot Topic on Retention. So,

Recruiting Committee Members: The Pilot Council set a deadline of 20 July for responses to its paper on Potential Changes to the u3a Model Constitution. I had 9 replies altogether from the Region and it's clear that quite a lot of thought went into these – many thanks. I'll be following this up with the Council at its next meeting.

Membership Numbers: I've now received a schedule of figures from u3a Office for the Region for the end of March 2023. It's not complete as not everyone has sent their returns in as yet. Where I have been able to make direct comparisons, they are as follows:

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Facebook advertising - Ilkley

We used Facebook advertising to promote our annual showcase event in July.

We targeted those over 50 within 10 miles of Ilkley and spent £25. The results are as follows:

- Reach (number of people to whom the post was shown): 3,622
- Engagement (total number of reactions, comments, photo views, link clicks):
 482
- Reactions (number of people who liked or commented on the post): 45
- Link clicks (number of people who clicked on the link): 70

Our social media guru Helen says the key here is the link clicks – each one of these cost us 36p (£25 divided by 70). But of course, the £25 also covered the additional general exposure (i.e. people who saw the post and potentially 'noted' it, but didn't click the link to the website).

In the 7 days from Sunday 18th June we had 5 new members so close to our average of one per day. In the 7 days following Sunday 25th June we have been joined by 22 new members. So the impact of publicity surrounding the event and the day itself clearly had an impact.

Hi everyone,

Firstly I'd like to thank every u3a who voted for my return as Regional Trustee for a second term. I am very excited about continuing to work in the region and at national level at this time. There are many good things going on, not the least of which are the Fit for the Future programme and the first national Festival which takes place in our region next summer.

Check your calendars! Our national u3a festival is beginning to take shape and so if you haven't made a note of the dates please do. It will be held at the University of York next July between Thursday 18th and Saturday 20th. It's a fantastic opportunity to connect with fellow members, participate in all manner of interest groups, and celebrate the joy of u3a membership. We'll be sharing more details as we can. As many of you know we are going through a process to make the Third Age Trust Fit for the Future and I remain positive about these changes and how they will enable the Trust to better serve the u3as in the regions and in particular, how your voices will be better heard. The most recent pilot council meeting which took place on 20th September was very positive. There will be more about this at the Trust AGM on 18th October.

Whilst the programme of change is challenging I endorse its aims to explore new ways of strengthening our U3A movement. At our last meeting the agenda was primarily made up of items suggested by u3as. If you have anything you would like to be discussed in a wider forum and which you think is of importance to u3as across the movement please do let me know and I will put them forward. Finally the National Annual General Meeting (AGM) will take place on 18th October. Please make sure you check out the national website if you wish to be there in person or online. You will also find all the details for your u3a to register to vote and details of the resolutions put forward.

If you have not already done so, please complete the vote registration form to nominate someone to vote on behalf of your u3a at the AGM and confirm the method of voting to cast your allocated vote/s.
