# Our Speakers by Jules Lee.

Hello to you all, thank you to everyone who joined us for the March social meeting. It was a wonderful turnout for a really special event. I am so grateful to Susie and Kevin for creating a talk just for us. In all my time as your Speaker Secretary I think this is one of the most interesting talks that I have brought to you.

I am pleased to tell you that in May, in order to mark the King's Coronation, I have been able to add an extra event to our calendar and I am delighted to offer you a special talk from our local art historian, Ed Williams.

The title of Ed's talk will be: **Projecting Majesty, Royal Portraiture, through the Centuries'** and will be held at **The Hoylake Community Centre at 2.00pm on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> May** Ed will explore and consider how the image of monarchs over the past 1000 years has changed, how portraiture was used as propaganda, projecting an image of the 'ideal monarch' and how an element of that remains even to this day. We are able to offer this as a free event for our members

Ed is currently being considered by the Arts Society to join their bank of freelance lecturers; the final stage involves him being observed giving a talk to a large audience. He has kindly offered to donate his time for free so that he can be assessed.

For Ed to meet the assessment criteria from the Arts Society, he needs in excess of 50 people to attend. We will therefore be asking members at the next social meetings to let us know if they intend to come along. This will also help us to estimate how many seats to put out etc. but also ensure that we provide the requisite 50 people to fulfil Ed's assessment criteria. There will be no refreshments available from the U3A but Popsy's café will be open.

Our sincere thanks go to everyone who have renewed their membership promptly it makes management of our u3a so much easier.

Our 2023 - 2024 renewal period has now ended. Renewal tables are no longer in situ at monthly meetings and anyone who has not already let us know their intention to renew in April will be unable to scan their

membership cards to gain entry to the monthly meetings, nor will they be able to attend an Interest Group meeting.

You may wonder why it is so important for us to have renewals in by the beginning of March. One reason is the general data protection regulation which does not allow us to retain contact details of non-members; the other is that we are obliged to pay a £3.50 capitation fee to the Third Age Trust (TAT) for every member listed on our Beacon database on the 15<sup>th</sup> March.

In previous years we have discovered that we have paid that capitation fee for members who ultimately did not renew. We cannot afford to continue that practice.

A notice of our January renewal meeting is circulated at the end of November and reminders continue until March, but even so, at present, despite the reminders and other attempts to contact them, we have some 15 members who have not let us know whether they intend to renew or not.

We often find that after deleting non-payers from our database they attend a meeting later in the year and announce their intention to renew. This causes holdups for potential new members and extra work for the membership team having to repeat the membership process all over again. We are all volunteers and feel that this is unnecessary work for us.

The Committee has therefore decided that next year, unless there has been an unavoidable reason, we will be charging a 'late renewal fee' to anyone who has not renewed their membership by the beginning of March. I am sure most of you will agree with this decision. Please let us know what you think.
