When the transportation of prisoners to the North American colonies ceased in 1776, the Prisons in England quickly reached bursting point. Decommissioned Royal Navy vessels were brought into service as Prison Ships with many moored off the coast of the Isle of Sheppey. Conditions aboard were dreadful with overcrowding, starvation, neglect and filth, disease ran rife in the populations onboard with 1 in 4 expected to die. Remains of convicts were interred on Deadman's Island, a watery grave just off the coast of Queenborough.
