Last time, cuddly teddy bears. This time, Eva Braun, Adolf Hitler's mistress. It would be hard to find two topics which are, shall we say, so many light years apart.

Our speaker Melanie Gibson-Barton is making her second visit to the Isle of Sheppey u₃a. You may recall that she gave us a highly entertaining and informative presentation two years ago on the history of teddy bears. Many of you brought along your own teddies.



This time her subject matter could not be more different. We shall be learning about the life and death of Eva Braun, Hitler's mistress and very briefly, his wife.

The couple committed suicide on 30th April 1945, less than 40 hours after they exchanged their marriage vows, as Soviet troops closed in on their Berlin bunker.

Eva Braun met Hitler in Munich in 1929 when she was a 17-year-old assistant and model for his personal photographer, Heinrich Hoffmann. She began seeing Hitler often about two years later and she became his constant companion, though their relationship was kept secret from the German public. Hitler believed that marriage would decrease his appeal.

You don't have to be a student of the Second World War to be fascinated by the story of the Nazi leader responsible for the death of millions and the teenage girl who eventually became his bride.

When someone tells you they are employed as a "Happiness Associate" you know things aren't going to end well.

It didn't, because the individual with the ludicrous job title failed to make me happy with her reply to my complaint.

I won't bore you with the details, but I was complaining to a company which had failed to provide the service I had paid for.

It got me thinking how any boss in their right mind could possibly think that a customer service employee who has to describe themselves as a "Happiness Associate" could ever be taken seriously.

This rather surreal email exchange I had with the young lady in customer service, who presumably would be sacked if she so much as frowned at any point during the day, got me thinking that so many shop and store staff now have silly job titles, though "Happiness Associate" is so far a clear winner.

Wandering around Kent's largest shopping centre a couple of weeks before last Christmas, I couldn't help noticing that a soon-to-arrive fashion store was advertising for "merchandising visuallers."

Apparently, no other employees were required in this shop. I thought: If everyone is busy visualising merchandise, who's going to take the customers' money?

Then it dawned on me. Stores don't employ shop assistants any more. They do, of course, but it's all part of the growing trend to give staff fancy names. The theory must be that in today's inclusive world it's demeaning to call a shop assistant a shop assistant!

Supermarkets and department stores are the worst offenders. There are no check-out staff at the tills, no shelf fillers, no customer service staff or any cleaners. Even the cheerful little chap who rounds up the trolleys in our local supermarket car park isn't a member of staff.

Like everyone else, he's a "colleague."

The use of this word fascinates me. It implies that everyone who works in a supermarket or department store is best mates with everyone else around them, all "colleagues" together in one big happy family. In the real workplace world, not the fantasy, human resources version, it's not like that at all. It certainly wasn't like that some of the offices I worked!

It's all got so daft now that "colleague" has morphed into a job title, as in "Please speak to a colleague if you have a problem with one of your purchases."

If you're really lucky, in one department store chain you might be elevated to the dizzy heights of being a "partner," considerably more grand than being a "colleague" and certainly a cut above being just a

mere member of staff. I've even heard shop assistants described as "retail associates," which sounds so pumped-up you might be forgiven for thinking they are just a few notches below managing director!

Of course, fancy job titles are not the sole preserve of shop staff. Most of us have been around long enough to remember when dustmen were upgraded to binmen and now, to give them the official title, "refuse collection operatives." And it surely can't be long before a waiter becomes a "culinary choice adviser."



Someone, somewhere, in a human resources department is bound to come up with the idea sooner or later.

Which reminds me, didn't human resources used to be called the personnel department, until some politically correct individual decided that "personnel" was far too disparaging a word to be applied to people?
