Dear Member

I hope you are all safe and well and haven't suffered too much damage in last week's storm. The cancellation of our meetings at the end of the week felt a bit like going into lockdown again, but I hope we can get back to our normal activities this week.

Lunch

I have just sent our menu choices and seating arrangements to St Brelade's Bay Hotel – hard to believe that our Christmas lunch is just over 3 weeks away, on Thursday, 30th November. We would particularly like someone to organise another walking group – perhaps for those who like to go a bit faster than the current group.
