New Rules for Voting



Are you and your members fully aware that when they come to vote at the Spring 2023 elections they will need to have proof of who they are? Photo ID has been introduced for all forthcoming elections – national, county and parish – as a standard requirement. For many it will not be an issue as they already have passports and/or photo-card driving licences. But suppose that you don't have those forms of ID; what can you show to prove who you are?

The attached document has the answers for most people – please feel free to include it with your own newsletters or have copies available at monthly meetings.

Now is the time to take this on-board rather than wait until the elections are imminent.

New Rules on Voting ID

Have You Got A Photo ID For Voting?

Due to changes in UK government legislation, you will now need to show photo ID at polling stations in our local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Suitable photo ID will include your passport or driving licence (this includes provisional), as well as blue badges, certain concessionary travel cards, identity cards with PASS marks, biometric immigration documents, defence identity cards and certain nation identity cards.

If you don't currently have an acceptable form of photo ID, or if your current photo ID does not look like you, then you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can <u>apply for this here.</u>

When Will You Need Your Photo ID?

From 4 May 2023 you'll need to show photo ID when voting in person in some UK elections or referendums.

You'll need it to vote in:

- UK Parliament by-elections
- local elections in England (including councils, mayors, the Greater London Authority and parishes)
- recall of MP petitions in England, Scotland and Wales
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections in England and Wales
- neighbourhood planning referendums and Business Improvement District referendums in England
- local authority referendums in England (including Council Tax increase referendums)

Check If You Have Acceptable Photo ID

You'll need one of the following types of photo ID to vote:

- a UK or Northern Ireland photocard driving licence (full or provisional)
- a driving licence issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Isle of Man or any of the Channel Islands
- a UK passport
- a passport issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein or a Commonwealth country

- a PASS card (National Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- a Blue Badge
- a biometric residence permit (BRP)
- a Defence Identity Card (MOD form 90)
- a national identity card issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein
- a Northern Ireland Electoral Identity Card
- a Voter Authority Certificate
- an Anonymous Elector's Document

You can also use one of the following travel passes as photo ID when you vote:

- <u>an older person's bus pass</u>
- <u>a disabled person's bus pass</u>
- an Oyster 60+ card
- a Freedom Pass
- a Scottish National Entitlement Card (NEC)
- a 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- a Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- <u>a Northern Ireland concessionary travel pass</u>

The photo on your ID must look like you. You can still use your ID even if it has expired.

Committee Nomination Form – AGM Date: 16th February 2023

Committee members serve for a normal term of 3 years. The "Officer" posts of Treasurer and Secretary must be filled to comply with our constitution. The current Treasurer will complete 4 years at the AGM and must therefore retire. The Secretary role is currently vacant. The Minutes Secretary is standing down at the AGM.

The maximum number of committee members (including "Officers") is eight and they should be drawn from different u3as as far as possible, although this can be varied to ensure the Network can continue to function. Nominees and Nomination Approvers must be members of u3as that are members of the Leicestershire & Rutland Network of u3as.
