## Focus on: Learning a Language with the U3A

Language learning groups have been part of the U3A tradition from the beginning and we have a strong set of groups in Littleborough. Groups are usually relatively small because that gives all members a real chance to participate. We learn together, helping each other, not competing and hoping for a chance to try out our new language skills in their native land one day. They say that learning a language is one of the best things we can do to keep our brains healthy and active as we get older.

At the moment we are looking to set up two new language groups: German and a new Beginners' French Group. Watch this space for more news of these.

Here is a little information about each of the current language groups. I was asking a lot of convenors to take time out of their Christmas celebrations to write to me – so a big thank you to those who did.

French

**Bonjour!** 

The longest running of our language groups and always very popular, this group meets weekly on Thursday mornings in the convenor's house to speak and learn French through fun activities and to learn about French culture and life as well. The group motto is 'Fun, friendship and French'

#### Spanish

#### Hola

We have two Spanish groups, both meeting on Friday afternoons in members' homes. Here is what Roger Crossley, convenor of the Spanish Improvers Group says:

#### **Spanish Improvers**

'We are a small informal group, currently 5 people, who meet every Friday afternoon for a couple of hours at one of our houses to talk in Spanish and do exercises to improve our grammar, vocabulary and confidence in Spanish. We are self-taught using whatever external resources we can muster and our members take turns to conduct each week's session. This may involve listening exercises, reading and translation, discussion and games. Most weeks we each will prepare a charla, a short talk about a random topic. In addition from time to time we will have an external activity, usually going for a (more or less) Spanish meal, often joined by previous members. As to achievement level — think an average GCSE grade.'

We have no fewer than four Italian groups in Littleborough U3A including a brand new Beginner's group. Here is the message from Sue Robinson and Emer Duckworth who are convening this new group:

We are meeting up at Littleborough Bowling Club on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> January at 10.30 and then fortnightly. Our aim is to enjoy learning and to foster a love of the Italian language and culture ... we are so looking forward to it.'

#### Italian Improvers 2

From Tricia Swaby, convenor of Italian Improvers Group 2 which meets on alternate Tuesday mornings in the convenor's home:

At present there are 3 members and me. One lady has recently joined and is a beginner. Others attend when they can to practice their Italian and plug gaps in their knowledge. There could be space for two more members if anyone is interested to join who has already done a bit of Italian.

Italian Improvers 1: Convenor Jo Wiggans.

We meet in my house on alternate Wednesday mornings. We aim to always have a chance to practice speaking Italian, reading and listening and responding to questions. Sometimes we do a little research – e.g. we take a region of Italy and group members prepare a short text on the food, the sights, where to stay, how to get there etc. to share with the group. We also do grammar revision, especially of the verb forms. The group currently has 9 members and is full.

Italian Conversation: Convenor Valerie Leach. This group has 8 members and meets fortnightly on Wednesday mornings (alternating with the group above) in the homes of members. The group concentrates on conversation, chatting in Italian and reading Italian texts. Members have mostly been studying Italian for a few years.
