We can but hope that the sunshine will return for the remaining outings planned for this summer. There are still some places available on the following:


July 19th: Lytham and Lytham Hall. Cost £29 includes a guided tour of the hall and coach from Littleborough or Rochdale.

4. U3a Interest groups online

Just in case we in Littleborough don't have the group you need or just in case there comes a time when you are more stuck at home than usual and you really want something to keep your mind active, or just in case you want to take a look at what else the u3a nationally has to offer: there are a number of national online groups that are open to all. The national website has the details: www.u3a.org.us/learning/interest-groups-online

The groups work in a range of ways, maybe with a lecture or presentation or introduction followed by discussion or activities. They meet at set times and you do have to register as a member of u3a groups online (this is a separate membership from your local u3a) and pay a fee of £12 per year to join. This gives you access to a wide range of groups. Note that some groups are full. Subjects vary from Armchair archaeology to Zentangle (?) through the languages, Crime, Railways and a host of other interests.
