Set mainly in Newfoundland, it tells of downtrodden, henpecked Quoyle returning to his family roots and a position on a local newspaper reporting on shipping movements. For one member of our

group, it was a nostalgic trip back to his youth on the Canadian prairies and for another. a reminder of her mother's earliest years in Saskatchewan. We're clearly an international bunch! A dark story with some funny and some poignant moments and all agreed that Annie Proulx's writing was atmospheric and fitting of both the story and its setting.

On November 15th, we will meet up to discuss <u>Go Tell it on the Mountain</u> by James Baldwin. *Drawing on James Baldwin's own boyhood in a religious community in 1930s Harlem, it tells the story of Johnny Grimes. Johnny is destined to become a preacher like his father, Gabriel, at the Temple of the Fire Baptized, where the church swells with song and it is as if 'the Holy Ghost were riding on the air'. But he feels only scalding hatred for Gabriel, whose fear and fanaticism lead him to abuse his family. Johnny vows that, for him, things will be different. This blazing tale is full of passion and guilt, of secret sinners and prayers singing on the wind.*


