1. Welcome and Agenda - Liz Day (Chair)

Liz welcomed all attendees and introduced the Steering Group — Judith Altshul had offered to take Minutes. *More volunteers are urgently required to help keep the peer group going* —could be on a rotational basis. If you'd like to discuss, please contact Liz Day: liz@the-days.org.uk

2. Structure and remit of London Region - Catherine Ware.

Introduction to London Region of U3As (see Welcome page, LRU3A website)
London Region, which is one of the 12 governance areas of the Third Age Trust, currently has 43 u3as and nearly 26,000 members. London Region of U3As (LRU3A) is a mutual-support network for all u3as in the London Region. Membership of the London Region network is free and voluntary, and u3as are represented at quarterly meetings by Chairs or nominated Delegates. LRU3A provides a national voice for London u3as via the London Region Trustee who attends committee and quarterly meetings.

The LRU3A AGM will be on 22nd October (on Zoom). It will be recorded and uploaded for the benefit of all members. Speakers:

- Ian McCannah, Ex-Chair of Third Age Trust: 'Reflections on the Challenges and Opportunities Facing the u3a Movement" and
- Ann Keating, Trustee for Scotland: 'Online Across Scotland'

Network Link is a national network of about 70 geographical networks of u3as, including LRU3A. Networks develop organically for mutual support and are not part of the Third Age Trust governance structure. Networks vary enormously according to local needs and preferences, and some u3as belong to more than one network.

In addition to geographical networks, there are role-based Peer Group networks (such as the GCNet). Increasingly, interest group/subject networks are also being developed. Northumbria Region u3a https://u3asites.org.uk/northumbria/page/73754 has several role-based networks, including a Groups Coordinators network. They were invited to attend our meeting but the network Coordinator was away so it appears the message did not get through and no-one came.

Catherine then talked about the efforts being made to keep members in touch with u3a during the Covid pandemic, including the formation of the <u>Trust u3a</u>, a national online u3a set up to promote recruitment during lockdown. This now has 900 members and is asking for new group leaders/convenors to step up. Will this interfere with our local efforts? See <u>Trust u3a Interest Groups and Courses Bulletin – September 12th 2021 Catherine suggested that we invite Christine Winner, Groups Coordinator of the Trust u3a, and also Chair of the Third Age Trust Learning Committee, to come to a future GCNet meeting.</u>

Jo Walters spoke for a few minutes about her role as Research and Shared Learning Coordinator advising on research and active learning in the London Region. Current projects include a shared learning project with the Coram foundation (Foundling Hospital) and one with London Transport researching the old minute books, with special reference to the beginning of the 'Electric Railway' which became the London Underground. There is also a national project which all u3a members can join to upload information and photos of the changing face of our <u>High Streets</u>.

3. Connecting up with Conveners

Catherine gave some links to the latest government guidance on Covid.

- Covid update background reading: Government Coronavirus guidance (August 16th)
- How to stay safe and prevent the spread
- 11 tips to cope with anxiety about coming out of lockdown

The session on Getting u3as Going Again included an account by Diana Pavey of meetings she held in Crouch End with conveners of similar groups to encourage them to keep in touch with their members and to be inclusive, although this may be difficult. Zoom is the preferred meeting format for about 50% of her groups, but not liked by all members. Also members were divided on whether to meet again in person or not. They discussed alternatives to meeting in people's homes, such as hiring larger venues.

There was discussion about risk assessments. Coordinators have mixed views on how strictly these should be carried out. To avoid individual risk assessments, some use public venues, such as pubs and cafes, which have carried out their own risk assessments. Dulwich and District u3a have developed a Risk Assessment for interest groups meeting in members' homes:

Vivek Nanda then talked about blended or hybrid meetings. He said that it was difficult to recommend suitable equipment, as local groups have a range of skills and needs. He suggested that coordinators try local places of worship and community groups for advice and perhaps to borrow equipment on a trial basis. Sometimes local community venues are already set up for hybrid meetings. He added that making approaches to local organisations is a good opportunity for outreach and recruitment of new 'diverse' members.

And talked about a programme that has been set up by u3a centrally to deal with questions and suggestions about equipment needed for different types and sizes of meeting and ways of managing hybrid meetings (see details next page)

In the ensuing discussion, several coordinators said that they were already using or considering using venues already set up for hybrid meetings, such as churches and other religious or community centres. One had been able to borrow equipment from a larger organisation to try out.

4. Opening Interest groups wider.

Judith Altshul talked about recruiting a member who lives in Palermo to run the Intermediate Italian Group.

Vivek described how he runs his Bite Size groups – taster sessions, short courses based on MOOCs, and Slow Book Groups discussing a book in depth, one chapter at a time. His talk elicited a lot of questions and it was agreed that he would go into this topic in greater depth at a future meeting.

Catherine reminded coordinators that Subject Advisers are helpful in giving groups ideas to explore. Currently 'Climate Change' is a hot topic and it is hoped to organise a regional network group to pool ideas on this and perhaps organise an event open to all members.

5. Recruiting new members

Judith described the Open Day that is being organised in Islington to try to regenerate groups and arouse interest in members as well as to recruit new members.

6. Breakout Rooms

Coordinators then moved into to discuss the topics raised in the presentations.

7. Feedback

Some u3as are planning Open Days.

Suggestions were:

- To hold open days in different parts of a large borough to spread the word.
- To have themed open days, e.g. 'International', 'Creative' to show members and the public different aspects of u3a.
- To have more 'on the street' information events, e.g. stalls.
- Celebrations/affirmations are important.

Other discussion points:

- In a large u3a committee members can each take on responsibility for contacting a few groups to support them and the coordinator.
- A start up payment or £50-100 is given to new groups to launch them.
- Different ways of charging for membership/interest group membership.
- Hearing workshops are held to help new users of hearing aids to get more out of meetings.
- Chat facility used in large meetings with one person monitoring the chat for the speaker.
- In person summer party
- Virtual coffee morning.
- Difficulty of recruiting convenors.
- Older conveners have lost energy. Try to support them/induct younger conveners.
- Restaurants/pubs have already done risk assessment and using them is helping local economy.
- Membership now possible world- wide. How to combine local and distant members in activities. We are both a learning and a social organisation.
- Zoom is both inclusive and exclusive.

8. Further issues for future discussion/attention

The following were raised:

- Too much on the agenda.
- Earlier and longer breakout discussion in future meetings to share ideas.
- More about hybrid meetings.
- More about Bite size meetings.
- Surprise that risk assessment seems not to be considered essential.
- Put link to risk assessment in the minutes.
- Future discussion on Diversity.
- More people are needed on the Steering Committee.
